## ***Program Activities – FALL 2009***

### ***Bowling at Crenshaw Lanes – October 21, 2009***

Person-Hours: 20 Hours

A social event is held every semester to encourage allow the prospective inductees to meet the current members and vice versa. The fall semester's social event was a bowling night at Florida State University's *Crenshaw Lanes*. Seven members and three prospective members attended the event which lasted from 7 to 9 pm.

### ***Leon County Swim Meet – October 28, 2009***

Person-Hours: 6 Hours

As part of HKN's commitment to public service, the Lambda Delta chapter participates in several community service events throughout the year. The first community service event of the 2009-2010 year was at the Leon County swim meet. HKN members and potential inductees volunteered as time keepers for the swim meet. The event was held between 11 am and 1 pm and three members volunteered.

### ***Fall 2009 Induction – November 10, 2010***

Person-Hours: 82 Hours

The second class of HKN Lambda Delta members was inducted on November 10, 2010, at 7:00 pm. Ten new members were inducted, and the executive board and faculty advisors were in attendance. The induction was held at the FAMU-FSU College of Engineering. After the induction, the new members, old members, and faculty advisors celebrated by dining at Olive Garden. A new tradition was formed by having the chapter cover the cost of the meal for the new members.

### ***Hot Chocolate Fundraiser – December 11, 2010***

Person-Hours: 12 Hours

As the semester was entering finals week and the weather starting to shift to winter, the chapter decided to hold a fundraising event selling hot chocolate at the FAMU-FSU College of Engineering. The table was operated by three people for four hours, between 1 and 5 pm. The table offered hot

chocolate and marshmallows, and gave cups of hot chocolate as a gift for donations of any size. At the end of the day the event raised \$15.75.

## ***Program Activities – Spring 2010***

### ***Engineering Day – January 19, 2010***

Person-Hours: 4 Hours

Every semester, there is an engineering career fair at the FAMU-FSU College of Engineering. The President and Treasurer made a compilation of the Lambda Delta chapter's resumes and burnt them onto a CD to be distributed. These were handed out to the different firms (about 100) so they could see what exemplary members the group has. This proved to be successful as different members actually got job interviews from the resumes on the CD.

### ***CAPS Open House – February 27, 2010***

Person-Hours: 85 Hours

Every year, the *Center for Advanced Power Systems* at Florida State University holds an open house event which allows the general public of Tallahassee to attend and view demonstrations and presentations of current research of the facility. There were approximately 20 demonstrations ranging from cryogenics, power electronics, megawatt-level machine labs, high-voltage dielectric materials, and a hybrid electric formula race car. The Lambda Delta chapter volunteers at this event helped in general set-up and operation during the event. The members helped make programs for the event, register guests, guide guests through the tour, and helped attending children take place in a scavenger hunt. The five hour event drew a record number of approximately 500 visitors. The Lambda Delta chapter had 17 volunteers for the entire 5 hours, with several volunteers arriving early and leaving after the conclusion of the tour. Besides assisting with the operation of the tour, this event was a great opportunity for the chapter to establish its presence in the community due to the large presence of industry and academic personnel.

### ***Cookout at 'The Reservation' – March 27, 2010***

Person-Hours: 56

The semester's social activity was held at Florida State University's Reservation, a 73-acre facility located next to Tallahassee's Lake Bradford. The main event for the chapter was the cookout, which included hamburgers and hotdogs supplied by the chapter. Aside from the food, the chapter enjoyed the spring weather with games of Frisbee, canoeing, kayaking, and rock climbing on a 40-ft rock wall. As with the previous semester's social, this event allowed for the new potential inductees to

socialize with the current members outside of a collegiate setting. Overall, 14 members attended the four hour event, including 3 potential inductees.

## *Spring 2010 Induction – April 9, 2010*

Person-Hours: 40

The second induction of the year took place at the FAMU-FSU College of Engineering at 7:00 pm on April 9, 2010. This marked the one year birthday of the Lambda Delta chapter, which was officially inducted on April 10, 2010. The ceremony was officiated by seven of the executive board members, with one member in attendance, and inducted two members. Following the ceremony, all in attendance went to Carrabba's Italian Grill, not only for the induction of the new members, but for both the year anniversary of the chapter induction and as a final outing of the chapter's graduation members.
