IEEEXtreme Award Guidelines

(Aug 2022)

Award description

This award is designed to encourage IEEE student members to participate in the <u>IEEEXtreme</u>, which is a global challenge in which teams of IEEE Student members compete in a 24-hour time span against each other to solve a set of programming problems.

This award aims to encourage more students to participate -for the first time- and progressively improve their global ranking.

Eligibility

All Australian teams participate, complete and officially are ranked by the competition organisers will be eligible. There is no need to apply for this award. Regardless of their global ranking the top three teams with highest ranking in Australia will be recognised and awarded.

The Award

The two Australian teams who successfully complete the IEEEXtreme challenged and are ranked the highest in Australia receive the award. \$500 (AUD) for the 1st position and \$200 (AUD) for the 2nd position. The award will be presented to the team and shall be shared equally between the team members. All members of the third Australian team will receive a digital certificate.

Timelines

The award guideline will be available on Australia Council website. Australia Council and all sections will advertise the award ahead of the IEEEXtreme competition start each year (e.g. sending e-notice to all student members, sections' social media and websites).

After the IEEEXtreme organising committee announces the official rankings, Australia Council Student Activity Chair (SAC) will be responsible to review the results and announce the top three Australian teams. In case the SAC is vacant, Australia Council committee will be responsible to announce the top three teams.

IEEEXtreme takes place at the end of October each year, usually beginning on the third or fourth Saturday of the month and lasting 24 hours. The results are aimed to be announced as soon as possible and before December 31.

Following the official announcement by IEEEXtreme organisers, the AC awards will be announced on IEEE Australia Council website and winners will be contacted through their local section and student branch at their university.
