Minutes of the Annual General Meeting 2007 - IEEE DELHI SECTION

The Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the IEEE Delhi Section was held at 11:00 AM on April 29th 2007 (Sunday) at Indian International Centre, New Delhi. It was attended by 58 members.

The deliberations of the AGM are as follows

1. Welcome Address by the Chairman, IEEE Delhi Section

Mr. P. V. Ekande, IEEE Delhi Section welcomed the members to the AGM. He highlighted the important events during 2006 and elaborated upon the visit of the IEEE president Mr. Michael Lightner, meeting with the President of India Dr. A. P. J. Abdul Kalam and the four successful events organized by Delhi section in 2006. He expressed his gratitude to the EXECOM for helping to achieve a number of activities. He congratulated two members who have been elevated in IEEE ranks, Dr. Mini S. Thomas, who has taken over as the Student Activities Coordinator for Region 10. and as a members of the RAB SAC committee Dr. Subrata Mukhopadhyay and (PES) in to the TAB Society Review Committee.

- 2. Confirmation of the minutes of the General Meeting held on January 15th 2006
- 2.1 The minutes of the last General Meeting as circulated earlier were then approved by the house as proposed by Dr. Ram Nath and seconded by Prof. Bhim Singh. Mr. Asthana raised the issue of modification of clause 5.1 of the section by laws which will now be taken up by the next EXCOM. Dr. Ranjan Mallik enquired about the next Indo-Pak conference to be hosted by Pakistan and there were no communication as of now, regarding this from the Pakistan side.

3. Presentation of Activity Report by the Secretary

Dr. Mini S. Thomas, the Section Secretary presented the report on the activities of the Section during 2006. The section had 107 activities, of which 53 were administrative meetings. The 48 technical activities were primarily expert lectures by people of eminence on current topics and conferences. The section also hosted 4 major events in 2006, Power Indian conference in April 2006, All India Student Congress at Jamia MIllia Islamia in June, INDICON in September and PEDES in December. The section won many awards in 2006, the WIE affinity group and the PES chapter being

adjudged the outstanding affinity group and chapter worldwide.

- 3.1 Delhi section brought out one issues of the news letter BEACON in 2006, due to the efforts of the publication sub committee. Dr. Subrata Mukhopadhyay, the Electronic communication coordinator regularly circulated the section e newsletter *ieeedelhinews* every month, keeping all the members informed of the activities of the section.
- 3.2 After the discussion, the report was approved as proposed by Dr. R.G. Gupta and seconded by Prof. Bhim Singh.

4. Presentation of Financial Report by the Treasurer

- 4.1 Ranjan Mallik the section Dr. treasurer presented the audited accounts for the year 2006. Bharati Vidyapeeth Welcomes Guests from Pakistan



In order to maintain viability and to ensure that all geographic units are meeting the needs of their members, each unit is required by the Member and Geographic Activities Board to submit annual reports of the following items:

* Current officers – Please use the online officer report form to report your new officers within your geographic unit. The form is available at:

Section and Council Treasurers are responsible for submitting the 2007 financial report for their Unit, and any subunits (Subsection, Technical Chapters and/or Affinity Groups), by 22 February 2008. Units submitting reports later than 31 March 2008 will not receive rebate payment for 2007 activity. If the Section or Council is unable to obtain financial records from a subunit, it may opt to submit a statement that the subunit has failed to submit a timely financial report and waive its right to rebate for that particular subunit. а Delinquent subunits may be subject to probation or even dissolution.

If all reports are submitted or postmarked by the February deadline, your Unit will earn an additional 10% bonus to the total rebate. However, if the information submitted is not complete or contains errors, and if corrections are not submitted within 60 days of a written request, the 10% bonus will be forfeited. The written request provided by IEEE will clearly state what action is expected, the date by which it must be submitted and the consequence if not submitted.

Update Your Profile, Get Ready to Vote

The annual IEEE election is around the corner, and it's time to ensure your ballot reaches you. Make certain that the IEEE has your latest postal and e-mail addresses before 30 June.

This time around, ballots will be mailed by 1 August—one month earlier than in the past—so make sure the address you provide is where you would like the ballot package to be sent. You can access your profile at myIEEE (<u>http://www.ieee.org/myieee</u>) or through the Update Profile application (<u>http://www.ieee.org/coa</u>).

The new mailing date is one of several deadline changes to the annual election process that take effect this year. Voting members are to receive a paper ballot via first-class mail, with a postage-paid reply envelope. Included with the material will be information about how to access and return

ballots electronically. New members on record as of 30 June, as well as those elevated to member or graduate student member grades on or before that date, are eligible to vote.

The usual booklet provided with the candidates' biographies will be mailed only to members who voted by paper ballot in last year's election and to those who indicated in their member profiles that a booklet should be mailed to them. The booklet will not be mailed to members who submitted their ballot electronically or did not vote last year.

Here are the election deadlines:

30 June

• Eligible voting members must have updated their member profiles.

1 August

• IEEE annual election ballots are mailed to all voting members by this date.

1 October

 Last day for ballots to be received from members, by noon Central Daylight Time, USA (17:00 GMT).

INACTIVE CHAPTER & AFFINITY GROUP NOTICES

Sometimes they may even be holding meetings and simply forgetting to report them, so all that is needed is a reminder.

CONFERENCE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING/AGREEMENT (MoU/MoA)

In order to help the conference organizer, templates for Technical, Financial and Fiscal Agent MOUs have been posted on the Templates of Conferences and Legal Document website

http://www.ieee.org/web/conferences/organ izers/contracts.html. These templates can be used as written or as a guide in preparing a specific MOU. In some cases, depending on the exact wording, MOUs can have the binding power of a contract. Therefore, in addition to defining the roles of the sponsoring parties, the templates contain legal clauses to protect both parties. If you have an existing MOU in place you DO NOT have to rewrite the MOU, however, we recommend that you review the templates, and when possible, incorporate the legal clauses (indemnification, proprietary or confidential information, compliance notices, with laws, miscellaneous/general terms and counterparts) into your existing MOU. BEST BUSINESS PRACTICES FOR IEEE UNIT TREASURERS

Job details for the Unit Treasurer can vary, depending on the size and activity of the Unit. For example, IEEE Sections range in size from those with under 75 members, to one with more than 10,000 members, so it follows that the volunteers' work varies as well. However, in spite of Section differences, basic good business practices are the same for all. Following are three essential tasks for all IEEE unit treasurers:

(A) The Treasurer should present the Section/Chapter check register(s) to the Section ExCom at least two times during the year for review and approval. A Check register should always include name, date, amount, budget line and purpose for each transaction (for example, expense reimbursement, services provided, etc). The reason for this is to provide an independent review of expenses, and to ensure that the Section ExCom is informed and approves unit expenses.

(B) The Unit Chair and Treasurer should periodically review the original monthly account statements and compare them to a recent financial report. It is good business practice for unit leaders to review account activity so that more than one person has oversight of the financial records.

(C) All IEEE units must submit their signature/bank account cards, signed by all authorized unit officers, to IEEE for the required staff signature. The cards are then

mailed from IEEE directly back to the bank. This is to ensure that appropriate authorized signers and accurate signatures are on all accounts for the protection of IEEE assets and the protection of the Unit officers. Please be sure to remove all outgoing officers from the unit bank account. For Units outside of the United States, should local laws or banking rules prohibit this, an exemption must be obtained, using the form in the Financial Report.

First of all let me thank you all for the overwhelming support I received from you. Just to share as a part of quick reporting on the Joint Conference POWERCON2008 & 2008 IEEE Power India Conference with the theme "Technological advancements for the development of power sector", we are placing the following before you:

- What a coincidence, exactly 300 papers & 300 primary registrants.
- Sponsorship coming from Dept. of Science & Technology of Govt. of India (Gold), NTPC, Power Grid (both Silver), NDPL, Delta, & GE (all Bronze), while there were six Exhibitors displaying their products (software) in seven stalls and an international book-publisher providing hand-out in author's kit.
- Besides from India, with accepted papers from 30 countries of China, Taiwan. Thailand. Malaysia, Singapore, Indonesia, Vietnam. Korea, Japan, Iran, Saudi Arabia, UAE, Lebanon, Australia, New Zealand, Egypt, Algeria, South Africa, UK, Germany, Russia, Sweden, Netherlands, Switzerland, Norway, Turkey, Croatia, USA, Canada, & Brazil, delegates from most of the countries could make it.
