REMINDER - ANNUAL REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

In order to maintain viability and to ensure that all geographic units are meeting the needs of their members, each unit is required to submit annual reports for the following items:

Meeting activity – The minimum meeting requirements are 5 meetings for Sections and Subsections; 2 technical meetings for Chapters; 2 meetings for Affinity Groups. This information can be submitted online via the electronic [L31 meeting report form](#)

Current officers – Please use the online officer report form to report your new officers within your geographic unit via the [online reporting form](#) by 20 February 2009 in order to make sure that your unit qualifies for the 10% rebate bonus.

For questions regarding officer reporting, please contact MGA Staff via scs-officer-report@ieee.org.

Financial activity – Each Region, Section and Geographic Council Treasurer is responsible for submitting both the bank account disclosure form and the 2008 financial report for their unit and any subunits (Subsection, Chapters and/or Affinity Groups) to IEEE as soon as possible, but not later than the dates noted below.

31 January 2009 – Submission of the Bank Account Disclosure Form

20 February 2009 – Submission of the 2008 Geographic Unit Financial Report (in order to qualify for 10% rebate bonus)

31 March 2009 - Submission of the 2008 Geographic Unit Financial Report in order to receive the rebate.

BE AWARE OF CHECK FRAUD SCHEMES

Geographic Unit Treasurers should be aware that various check fraud schemes exist, and with the current financial crisis impacting the economy, fraudulent activity is on the rise. IEEE staff has been made aware that in some instances these fraudulent checks display the IEEE name and/or logo, the Operations Center address and even an IEEE Corporate account number. Security measures are in place with IEEE's bank to ensure that IEEE accounts (including Concentration Banking Program accounts) are not in jeopardy, and should a fraudulent check be presented for payment against the accounts, it will be recognized as invalid and fraudulent, and payment denied.

In order to protect IEEE's bank accounts and funds, it is strongly recommended that all bank statements/activity for local accounts maintained by IEEE Geographic Units or Conferences be reconciled in a timely manner, which is generally 30 days from receipt of the bank statement or its availability on-line. Failure to do so may result in the bank's refusal to reimburse the account for the fraudulent activity.

**IEEE Names E. James Prendergast
Executive Director**

Dr. E. James (Jim) Prendergast will assume the role of IEEE Executive Director on 6 April 2009. Dr. Prendergast will serve as chief operating officer and will manage the more than 1,000 IEEE staff members at seven U.S. and overseas locations. Prendergast's appointment comes after a nearly eight-month search by IEEE's Board of Directors. Dr. Prendergast most recently served as vice president and chief technology officer for DuPont Electronic and Communication Technologies in Wilmington, Del. Prior to joining DuPont, he was vice president and director of Motorola's Physical Sciences Research Laboratories, headquartered in Tempe, Ariz. A native Australian, Jim received his undergraduate degrees from the University of Sydney and his Ph.D. in electrical engineering from the University of Cambridge.

Prendergast succeeds former IEEE Executive Director Jeffrey W. Raynes, who resigned in June 2008.

Perhaps they need new volunteers, more financial support, a new place to meet, or ideas for new speakers. Sometimes they may even be holding meetings and simply forgetting to report them, so all that is needed is a reminder.

The [top ten SC08 recommendations](#) have been presented to the IEEE Board of Directors and the MGA Board has agreed to take ownership of the recommendations. An MGA Board member has been assigned the responsibility of working with other IEEE organizational unit(s) in providing a response to each recommendation. The MGA Board will provide status reports on the recommendations to all SC08 attendees on a regular basis, and the first reports should be available by June 2009. A final report on the top ten recommendations will be completed by December 2010.

MGA vTools Project - vTools.Meetings and vTools.WebInABox

The [MGA vTools](#) project continues to provide Sections, Chapters, and Affinity Groups with a set of volunteer-developed tools to assist them in managing their ongoing activities. After a successful pilot, vTools.Meetings has entered the production mode. In the latest release of the tool, officers can create meeting announcements without a webmaster. Members and the public may view upcoming meetings online,

Establishing a network of 2.4 GHz and 5.8 GHz Wi-Fi data communications links among small rural outposts
Identifying patients by facial characteristics in a clinical setting
Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) linked to medical records
