News on Meeting with Chair of IEEE, Western Australia Section

(as reported by Vijay K. Dutt on January 21, 2013)

- At the outset sincere thanks to Dr Kevin Wong and Dr Lance Fung was conveyed for sparing time out of their busy schedule.
- Dr Kevin Wong is the Chair of IEEE, Western Australia Section for 2012. Dr Lance Fung is also a Senior Member of IEEE.
- Dr Kevin Wong explained about activities of IEEE in Western Australia. The Section is vibrant with

approximately member strength as more than 800.

- 2-3 events are organized by the section every month. There is a good mix of members from Academics as well as Industry.
- 5. Visit to installations of Perth Metro which is Operated by Perth Transport Authority and meetings with Engineers Connected with Electric Traction was explained. Following salient points which make Perth Metro as a unique system were touched upon:

Perth Rail Based Urban Transport system (Operated by Perth Transport Authority)-installations visited-EMU Maintenance Shed, OHE Depot, Control centre, Traction substations and OHE Maintenance Depots.

Excellent points of Perth Rail Based Urban Transport system

Built on Surface: Bulk of the 5.1 alignment has been planned on Surface thereby greatly saving on Project cost. Taking system length as 200 KM for 5 lines and assuming per Kilometer additional cost of Viaduct/ underground as \$ 15 Million (a Conservative estimate) they have saved approximately \$ 3 Billion from the Project Cost. Since in Urban transport fare box recovery is a Challenge in order to provide commuters a low cost option this saving is valuable for long term viability and further expansion of the project.

5.2 Selection of 25 KV AC systems as system of Electric Traction. Delhi Metro Railway (DMRC) was one of the first systems in the world to have selected 25 KV AC system in preference to 750 Volt DC Third Rail system. This has provided further economy by saving cost of about 40 additional DC Traction Systems .Also being above ground the maintenance is easier. While DMRC 25 kV line was opened in 2002, Perth metro on 25 KV AC system started working about a decade earlier in 1993.

5.3 Selection Of 1057 MM Gauge: Along with Japan and Malaysia, Perth Rail Based Urban Trans port system is the only system to have adopted 25 KV AC system on 1057 MM Meter Gauge. Since bulk of the alignment of Trans Perth is on the Central Verge a narrower gauge has given the advantage of requirement of lesser space.

5.4Building along central Verge of Freeways: Since bulk of the system has come along Central Verge of Freeways it has given convenience in Land Accusition, easy access in case of accidents and emergencies and easy transfer to Bus systems. It was observed that by using this experience other systems elsewhere in the world can benefit.

6. Dr Wong was informed of significant work done in Electromagnetic Interference by 25 KV AC system provided on Thornlie line of Perth Rail Based urban Transport system. In this regard а paper on 'Longitudinal induction voltage measurement on communication cables running parallel to overhead lines' by Dean Sharafi of ,Western Power Corporation is relevant to Metro systems in India as Delhi Metro Railway (DMRC) was one of the first systems in the world to have selected 25 KV AC system in preference to 750 Volt third rail DC system. Also new Metro systems coming up in India in Cities of Chennai, Mumbai, Jaipur, Hyderabad etc are also based on 25 KV AC system of electric Traction.

- Dr Wong explained that at present 7. IEEE members are not there from Electric Traction. The potential members may be from operators like Perth Rail Based urban Transport system and Western Australia Railways and Industry like Bombardier and ABB who have presence in Electric significant Traction in Western Australia. Also given sufficient notice they would like to organise a Lecture on Electric Traction with emphasis on India and Western Australia.
- 8. Cooperation from New Delhi Chapter from TMC and other societies was offered. Also in case members from Perth chapter visit India, we would like to organise events for them.

The meeting ended with thanks to Dr Wong and Dr Fung and appreciation of their work in popularizing IEEE in Western Australia.

Obituary



Prof. Pavaguda Venkata Indiresan, former Director of Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Madras, passed away in Pune, Maharashtra, India on February 24, 2013 (Sunday) morning. The end came for this endearing teacher of electronics and electrical engineering in his hotel room, hours before he was to chair the Indian Election Commission's technical committee meet on Electronic Voting Machines. He was 85, and is survived by his wife Jaya, two daughters and a son.

Indiresan was educated in Presidency College, Madras, Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore and at the University Of Birmingham, UK. He began his teaching career at Roorkee University (now an IIT) and retired at the age of 65 from IIT Delhi after teaching for 40 years as detailed below.

1953-65 University of Roorkee (1957-60 in Birmingham, UK, doing his Ph, D.)
1965-79 IIT Delhi
1979-84 IIT Madras (as Director)
1984-86 IIT Madras (as a faculty member)
1987-93 IIT Delhi

A highly respected thinker, Indiresan was a member on countless Government of India (GOI) committees. He was given the Padma Bhushan in 2000 and twice awarded the highest prize of the Inventions Promotion Board by the GOI. He has been President of Institution of Electronics the and Telecommunication Engineers, and of the Indian National Academy of Engineering. He has the rare honor of being made an Honorary Member by the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE), USA "for contributions to the growth of electrical engineering in India through his leadership in education, applied research and professional engineering institutions" for 1998. The grade of Honorary Member is a significant honor bestowed by IEEE and is awarded for life to an individual. It was established through the Bylaws of the IEEE. Honorary Members are elected by the Board of Directors from among those who have rendered meritorious service to humanity in the IEEE's designated fields of interest and who are not members of the IEEE. Other two Indians to receive the same are Prof. Mambillikalathil Govind Kumar Menon, and former President of India (2002-07), Dr. Avul Pakir Jainulabdeen Abdul Kalam.

Every Prime Minister of India, from P. V. Narasimha Rao onwards sought Indiresan's

advice and respected his views even though he had been critical of each one of them in his writing. Perhaps that was because there was no rancour in his dissent. In fact it was amazing to witness his energy levels and organizational capacity. He would regale others with stories of his meetings with politicians and bureaucrats in Delhi.

He was extremely close to Kalam, before, during and after his Presidency. Kalam was a passionate votary of Indiresan's pet program PURA (Providing Urban Amenities in Rural Areas), which he felt was the only way to decongest our cities. With a lot of passion he would tell how it was so easy to implement his scheme.

Prof. Indiresan was a prolific writer on societal, economic and development issues. He had also written a book "Managing Development: Geographical Socialism, Decentralization and Urban Replication". In his later role, Indiresan who played as a columnist for the newspapers, like, The Hindu, Business Line, and Indian Express, often provoked debate and discussion for his frankness that went against traditional wisdom. Many found his frankness often controversial except some who believed in quality after he once bluntly said that majority of the teachers are inferior to the students. Similarly, Indiresan would go on to write in his Curriculum Vitae that he was proud of having been reprimanded before Indian Parliament for his expression that the proper way to get Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) students into higher education was not through quotas but through quality education from primary school itself. In consonance with this perception quietly and using his own funds, he would organize teaching camps for SC and ST Class XII students at the IIT campus, to prepare them for the IIT entrance examinations. Such was the Prof. legendary personality Pavaguda Venkata Indiresan.

Conferences Benefit from MCE Strategic Relationships

Recently, Meetings, Conferences and Events (MCE) was able to leverage long term supplier relationships and the strength of the IEEE brand to assist several conferences facing very different hotel related issues. Both were utilizing the same property months apart - one conference was short on pick up and facing a potential of a significant attrition payment; while the other needed to add sleeping rooms.

During the February 2013 IEEE Meeting Series, several changes to the Conference Audit Policy were approved and effective immediately.

1. The actual conference income or expense threshold is now revised to USD 250,000 (up from USD 100,000).

- Conferences where IEEE has greater than a 50% financial responsibility, including those that are solely IEEE sponsored, and where the actual income or expense is USD 250,000 or more must be audited by a fully qualified, independent, professional auditor.
- Conferences where IEEE has greater than 50% financial responsibility, including conferences that are solely IEEE sponsored, and where the actual income or expense is less than USD 250,000 will be audited on a periodic basis. The IEEE Internal Audit Department will schedule and arrange for the audits of these conferences. For those conferences not scheduled for an Internal Audit review in a given year, an audit should be conducted by a committee composed of individuals who have no direct or indirect responsibility for the financial transactions of the conference.
- Co-sponsored conferences, where IEEE has a 50% or less financial responsibility (regardless of the actual income or expense level) are encouraged to participate in the audit process.

2. Accepted audit resources have been clarified to include **Certified Public Accountant, Chartered Accountant,** orequivalent source approved by the IEEE Internal Audit Department.

Alternatively, the Conference Chair may engage the IEEE Internal Audit Department to arrange for and/or perform the audit. The selection of such auditors shall avoid any conflict of interest with members of the Conference Organizing Committee.

Correct conference use of the IEEE Logo



Use of the IEEE logo in promoting a conference is a sometimes confusing and tricky subject. Following the simple steps below should help committees preparing conference call for papers, promotional materials, publications and websites:

Financial Sponsorship -

While approaching through communication to IEEE Delhi Section <<u>ieeedelhi@ieee.org</u>> please be specific to include response to the following points, besides clearly stating at least (i) Name of the Conference, (ii) Date/ Dates, (iii) Venue, and (iv) Organizing Entity /Entities vis-à-vis Organizers (Conference Chair, Technical Program Chair, Publication Chair, Finance Chair/Treasurer, Contacts).

1. Whether the proposed conference is being organized for the first time or it has been held earlier also. In case of latter, please furnish brief about the same.

2. Theme and areas covered by the conference and if possible, to which Society(ies) of IEEE the areas precisely belong.

3. If there is provision for plenary session / state-of-the-art lecture(s), the name(s) of possible speaker(s).

4. Time schedule with important dates – such as for, Abstract / Extended Abstract / Full Paper Submission, Acceptance Notification, Camera Ready submission, Registration, etc. (as placed with adequate interval of time).

5. Whether the accepted papers, after due presentation (oral or poster) only, are intended to be published through the IEEE Xplore, besides local publication. If yes, then specific information about the review process and estimated number of papers to be submitted and possible acceptance (may be going by the previous few such conferences projection can be made for this time). This is required in order to maintain quality of papers going to IEEE Xplore.

6. How is IEEE Delhi Section to be associated in organizing the conference in terms of human and other resources?

7. Preliminary budget with estimated income and expenditure under various heads.

Note: Inter-alia the response has to include IEEE Delhi Section Members with specialization in the area(s) to be covered by the Conference in its Technical Program Committee to monitor, along with others, quality of papers, time schedule from call of papers to final sending of papers for publication in the IEEE Xplore, if so, otherwise limited up to local publication, going through the process of submission of papers, peer review, acceptance of abstract / extended abstract / full-paper, final submission of camera-ready papers, etc. Accordingly this information will have to be reflected in the conference publicity media whether in e-form or hard copy, e.g., website, brochure, etc. In fact there is a need to know how the IEEE Delhi Section will be directly and substantially involved in developing the Technical program which is a requirement of IEEE to technically cosponsor and / or (financially) co-sponsor.

As the above facts and figures sought are of mandatory nature, these are to be furnished quite explicitly based on local experience and as projected, may be taking help of others too and as applicable at the time of submission of proposal for consideration by the IEEE Delhi Section Standing Committee on Technical & Professional Activities.

Upon acceptance, quoting URL: http://www.ieee.org/conferences_events/co nferences/organizers/required_documentati on.html, IEEE Conference Application Form has to be submitted online to register conference with IEEE, obtain a conference number, and to be listed on the IEEE Conference Search and the IEEE Call for Papers. Referring to the conference number thereafter a Memorandum of Understanding (based on available templates) is required to be signed when two or more organizational units (OUs) agree to provide technical or financial co-sponsorship to a conference. These OUs may be IEEE organizational units or IEEE and non-IEEE organizations. When IEEE Delhi Section is involved, obviously it would be an IEEE OU and one of the signatories, being Technical Co-sponsor or (Financial) Co-sponsor. Further, if in addition post-conference publication through IEEE desired, completed Xplore is IFFF Conference Publication Form is to be submitted also online and when asked in return, Letter of Acquisition has to be signed by the Conference Organizers well in time.

Besides the above-mentioned requirement that are of essential nature, depending upon financial involvement, as also required by the IEEE, it may be necessary to submit Principles of Business Conduct and Conflict of Interest (POBC/COI) form by the General Finance Chair and Chair/Treasurer, Contracts and Legal Documents to provide information on hotel and other contracts, Insurance coverage for an IEEE Conference, Conference Financial Information detailing Revenue and Expense as forecasted, followed by time to time updating, etc.

- Conferences organizers should plan to submit the publication form at least six months prior to the conference start date to ensure that all arrangements are ready when needed.
- Please limit any references to IEEE *Xplore* Digital Library only after the conference application for participation in the Conference Publication Program (CPP) has been accepted and you receive notification of acceptance in the program (This process is separate from conference approval).
 - Participation in the CPP is confirmed by the issuing of the Letter of Acquisition (LoA).
- In conference call for papers, websites and other materials, please use the following statement regarding publishing in IEEE *Xplore* :
 - Conference proceedings will be submitted for posting to IEEE *Xplore*

Conferences should not claim or guarantee that papers will be published in IEEE *Xplore* since IEEE reserves the right to withhold publishing of proceedings not meeting IEEE quality standards.

> Conferences should also not claim or guarantee that proceedings will be indexed in any database. Independent abstracting and indexing (A&I) services evaluate

each conference for consideration in their on-line products. Since each A&I partner makes its own editorial decision on what content it will index, IEEE cannot guarantee entries are included in any particular database.

Sustainable Meetings Certification Program Launched



"Green" and "sustainable" meetings have been industry catch phrases and emerging trends for quite some time, yet without consistent evaluation or measurement criteria.

In February 2013 the Green Meeting Industry Council (GMIC), announced an agreement to develop a certification program for the event industry's sustainability standard. iCompli, a global third-party assurance provider will manage the assessment, audit and certification process.

The APEX/ASTM Environmentally Sustainable Event Standards were released in 2012 to address environmental and social sustainability in the meeting and event industry. The standards specify specific performance criteria for staff management, communications, waste management, energy, air quality, water, procurement, and community partners. The standards were in partnership with ASTM created International, an ANSI-accredited standards development organization. The agreement, calls for GMIC and iCompl to work together in promoting the adoption and certification of the Standards.

With attendees often looking for conference options that support sustainability, these standards may help organizers distinguish your event from others, while also modeling good organizing practices.

IEEE Conference Exchange (ICX) Updates and Enhancements



In response to feedback from contributors regarding their

experience with the IEEE conference application process, IEEE Meetings, Conferences & Events (MCE) has undertaken a priority effort to make it more efficient and user-friendly.

MCE has established a phased approach to make changes to the ICX conference application form and system along with the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) template. The following changes represent the first phase in evolution of the ICX conference application and MOU template.

ICX/Conference Information Schedule Changes - Phase 1

- Step 2, "About the Event": country is a required field; city and state are no longer required fields
- Step 3, "About the Location": only the country field is required; all other fields are optional

• Step 3 & 6: Zip code is no longer a required field

ICX/MOU Template - Phase 1

Under the area labelled "RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SPONSORING PARTIES" the following items were removed:

- List the sponsors that are represented on the Technical Program committee
- Describe the role of each sponsor represented on the Technical Program Committee
- Does the conference committee have full authority to operate the conference? Yes/No
- Is the oversight committee made up of representatives from each sponsor?
- Who appoints the conference committee chairs and other key members?
- Who approves the conference budgets?
- Who establishes registration fees?
- Under the area labeled "TECHNICAL PROGRAM" the following items were removed:
- What is the structure of the technical program committee?
- What is the estimated number of submitted papers?
- What is your targeted acceptance rate for submitted papers?
- How many named reviewers will be associated with this conference?
- What criteria will be used by your reviewers to evaluate submissions?
- Are you using student reviewers?
- How will you ensure that all accepted papers will be presented?

If the submitter of the Conference Application indicates that their conference materials will not be part of the CPP we will also remove the following items under the area labelled "TECHNICAL PROGRAM"

- What materials are being reviewed?
- What type of review is being performed?
- How many reviewers will review each paper?


We are also removing the following clauses from all MOUs:

- "Governing Law": This MOU shall be governed, construed, applied and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of New York without regard to conflict of law principles.
- "Dispute Resolution": All disputes arising under this MOU or relating to IEEE's publication of the works shall be governed by New York law and heard by a court of competent jurisdiction in New York, New York. The Sponsoring Party consents to jurisdiction in New York, New York for that purpose.

United Airlines was the first to increase change fees, followed quickly by US Airways. For Domestic US flights, the cost to revise a non-refundable fare went up USD \$50, from \$150 to \$200. International flights also rose by \$50, up to \$300. These charges are on top off any fare difference charge. Fees on less restricted fares (with higher prices) or refundable tickets remain unchanged.

With earnings pressure being experienced by all carriers, industry watchers are forecasting most major carriers to follow suit. Travellers should fully understand the restrictions and fees before booking a specific fare. Some analysis of the total cost of the airfare may be very valuable.

US Flights Return to Normal - but for How Long?

The US air travel system was significantly impacted 21 -23 April by the furlough of air traffic control staff to comply with cuts resulting from the US budget sequestration process (a procedure in United States law that limits the size of the federal budget). Delta Airlines alone, cancelled nearly 90 flights each day, and those not cancelled experienced sizable ground delays.

Congress rushed through emergency legislation the past weekend that should prevent a re-occurrence. However, conference committees should be aware that in the current political climate, the situation could change rapidly. US based conferences scheduled for the remainder of 2013 will be well served to monitor this situation closely as it could impact attendees travel plans and conference hotel attrition, especially as the event date grows nearer. Inclusion of travel advice in confirmation materials may help lessen impacts and last minute scrambling.

Some updating for the Conference Organizers (by Section Technical & Professional Activities STDCOM Chair)

Continuing further with what was published in the April 2013 issue of e-newsletter, due to certain specific changes as per directives and / or expectations of IEEE Conference Operations and also Section, following is brought to notice of the organizers of IEEE Conferences by me as Chair of IEEE Delhi Section Technical & Professional Activities Standing Committee.

On Conference Papers:

- Though there is no hard and fast rule, but based on the practices in vogue and statistics, there should be peer review with best of 3 or more reviewers / experts with adequate time for review (say, about 3 months from the last date of submission of paper to final notification of acceptance, not withstanding communication taking in between),

- In order to avoid plagiarism right at the beginning, before sending manuscript of paper to reviewers through proper software (e.g., EDAS, etc.) there should be thorough check for similarity score for which 30% is the usual limit,

- Acceptance ratio, to maintain standard of an IEEE Conference, may not go beyond 50% usually, but in no case it should cross 60%, going by the precedence,

On constituting various Conference Committees:

- Though IEEE Delhi Section would be constituting an Oversight Committee consisting of IEEE Members depending upon areas covered by the event, Conference Organizers should try to include in the various Conference Committees IEEE Members of discipline(s) in which the Conference is there. They may be local or from outside.

On the usage of IEEE logo and its name: Until and unless IEEE and / or its Organizational Units (OUs) have financial stake of 50% or more, neither IEEE logo nor IEEE in the name of Conference should be used.

Main activities following consent of Section: After obtaining consent of IEEE Delhi Section, Conference Organizers are expected to follow the steps given below. - Submit a conference application at the following: <u>http://www.ieee.org/conferences</u> _events/conferences/organizers/conf_app.ht ml.

Then based on the information provided, IEEE system generates a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) that is customized for that specific conference. Thereafter, IEEE sends an email to the representatives of each sponsor (financial, technical) which contains a unique URL. With that URL they are able to review the MOU and submit their decision. Their decision is then captured by the IEEE system. Once approval is received from all the sponsor representatives (financial, technical), IEEE sends out a fully executed MOU which completes the MOU requirement.

- After the execution of MOU, it is necessary to fill online conference publication form (http://ta.ieee.org/InfoSched/Pub/Search.as **px**) for obtaining Letter of Acquisition (LoA) for the accepted conference papers, after presentation only, to go to IEEE Xplore that has to be duly signed and returned by the Conference Publication Chair or any other person designated to do so.

Expected lead time to hold Conference: In view of above, one can see that for organizing such sort of an IEEE level Conference it will require a lead time of at least 12 months, if not more. Accordingly interested ones have to follow what has been advised as above with proper planning of time schedule for holding the Conference in association with IEEE and / or its OUs.

In fact to all the Organizers of Conferences being held under the jurisdiction of IEEE Delhi Section and those contemplated in near future, in view of the two pertinent issues raised by the IEEE recently, further an alert is sounded in line with the stand taken by the IEEE, which is an eye opener.

The concerned two issues are namely related to (Financial) Sponsorship & Technical Sponsorship vis-à-vis signatories or those having consent to MOU, and Publication through IEEE Xplore (as highlighted above). No matter whether Organizers of Conferences are having an MOU executed off-line by filling up the associated form in pdf format, signed by the (Financial) Sponsor (for sole entity) / (Financial) Co-sponsors (for more than one entity) and Technical Sponsor (for sole entity) / Technical Co-sponsors (for more than one entity) and then submitted for endorsement of IEEE Conference Operations or submitted online with auto-generated MOU subsequently having consent of all involved in financial / technical sponsoring, it requires due attention on account of certain misconception on the part of Organizers of Conferences at any point of time.

In this context it may be understood that Patrons (usually tagged with an individual) and Friends of Conference, who may act in a unidirectional way for providing grant-inaid, will be having no responsibility for sharing surplus or deficit. As defined by the IEEE -

(Financial) Sponsor / Co-sponsors: Receives / receive a portion of the surplus or liable for a portion of the deficit resulting from a conference, plus have direct and substantial involvement in the development of the technical program. Organizations that contribute funds but do not receive surplus or have responsibility for deficit should not be listed as financial sponsors. They are classified as patrons or supporters.

Technical Sponsor/Co-sponsors: Has/have a direct and substantial involvement in the development of the technical program, but no financial stake in the conference surplus or deficit.

It is clarified further that only (Financial) Sponsor (for sole entity) / (Financial) Cosponsors (for more than one entity) and Technical Sponsor (for sole entity) Technical Co-sponsors (for more than one entity) are to endorse the MOU when submitted on-line or sign when sent off-line. In India very often we seek financial support that comes like grant-in-aid from various Departments / Ministries / Organizations of Govt. of India / State Governments or the Societies owned by them, Public Sector Undertakings, Companies in Private Sector. While Govt. Departments / Ministries / Organizations are not-for-profit entity, others are commercial ones being in the business. But one thing is common. They can be Supporters or Friends of Conference and not to be included as sponsor (financial / technical) in the MOU. As for instance, Research Development Defense & Organization (DRDO), which is a Govt. of India organization and hence a non-profit or not-for-profit organization, can be termed as "Supporter" or "Friend of Conference" like all other similar organizations or industries who would be providing grant-in-aid to the conference. DRDO as a Govt. of India organization will never sign as (Financial) Co-sponsor for taking responsibility of sharing surplus or deficit, be sure. For them it is like giving counter-guarantee that requires approval of Union Cabinet. For instance at the initial stage of privatization in various sectors in India for FDI (Foreign Direct Investment) one may remember to have seen such thing to happen. But it is not expected to happen for conference sort of thing. So it is advised not to put DRDO or as a matter of fact Department of Science & Technology (DST). Department of & Electronics Information Technology (DeitY), etc. in an embarrassing situation by urging them to sign or endorse as mentioned above.

Similarly there exists restriction too so far as IEEE Xplore publication is concerned. Conference website cannot or rather should not state something like ".... Conference is in the IEEE's Conference included Publication Program. This means that the ... Conference proceedings of accepted papers (for oral presentations) will be indexed and published online on IEEE Xplore." In fact Conference proceedings that meet IEEE quality review standards may only be eligible for inclusion in the IEEE Xplore Conference Digital Library. related communications such as conference website, email, direct mail solicitation, etc. may not reference or guarantee inclusion in the Xplore Digital Library. IEEE Further, conference communications may not reference or guarantee inclusion in any abstracting and indexing (A&I) databases, since inclusion in such databases is determined by independent A&I service providers and cannot be guaranteed by Misrepresentation of either IEEE. is considered a violation of IEEE brand quidelines.

Therefore, as suggested by the IEEE Conference Operations, Conference web-site may indicate something like,

"..... (Conference Name) has applied for inclusion in the IEEE's Conference Publication Program. This means that the Conference proceedings of accepted papers (for oral presentations) will be submitted to IEEE Xplore." Further, it is requested to insert at appropriate place(s) the following instead of what appears commonly for the Conferences.

"Organized and Sponsored by X / Cosponsored by X, Y, etc., and Technically Sponsored by ... (one or more IEEE Organizational Units, e.g., Section, Society Chapter / Affinity Group, Region, Society), with likely support of A, B, C, etc."

Without the above-mentioned two issues explicitly shown with due care - one on possibility of publication through IEEE Xplore (if applicable), and the other correctly on (financial) sponsor/co-sponsors, technical sponsor/co-sponsors, & supporter(s), if any, Conference may not get approval of IEEE Conference Operations when proposed or even if having approval earlier, may be null and void due to violation of MOU.

So please act now and confirm to that effect to Section (ieeedelhi@ieee.org) or IEEE Conference Operations (conferenceops@ieee.org) accordingly, of course if you agree. Otherwise, IEEE Delhi Section or any other IEEE Organizational Unit too may not be in a position to do anything to come out of the hurdle faced at any point of time during the course of journey.

Member Spotlight Leah H. Jamieson

IEEE's Past President Envisions the Future

When asked if Technical Activities has changed since she became a member of the IEEE nearly forty years ago, IEEE Fellow and former President Leah Jamieson says both Technical Activities and her perspective have changed.

"In my earliest interactions through Signal Processing and Computer societies, my focus was on specific research," she recalls. "I went to Technical Activities conferences and publications because I had interest in particular research topics."

Five years after completing her term as president and ten since her term as VP-TAB,

Jamieson is the president of the IEEE Foundation. "Compared to when I started my career, I see much more activity at the boundaries between research areas. These are reflections of how not only Technical Activities in IEEE has changed, but how the technical world has changed."

Jamieson says there is a growing conversation about how those boundary areas should be navigated: in IEEE, in the academia, and the technical community at large. "We grapple with how much we want students to have depth and how much we want them to have breadth. In reality, you need both, not in one person but collectively. It's important to have strong pillars but they must be pillars and not silos so you can build bridges across them." 

IEEE MGA Operations Manual Change - Geographic Unit Officer Term Limits

The IEEE Member and Geographic Activities Board approved a motion that limits the number of years any one individual may serve in any one geographic unit officer position. This term limit policy is applicable to the following geographic units: Region, Section, Subsection, Geographic Council, Chapters, and Affinity Groups. Section 9 -Geographic Organizational Units - of the MGA IEEE Operations Manual http://www.ieee.org/societies_com munities/geo_activities/operations_manual/i ndex.html outlines the new policy within each unit type's section of the manual. It states that: "All officers shall not serve in position. in anv anv one sinale organizational unit, more than six years in states total." The policy also that "exceptions to this rule require approval by the Region Director who will annually report such exceptions to the MGA Board."

MGA staff will be distributing notifications to those volunteers who are about to reach, have reached, or have exceeded the six year limit in one position in the same organizational unit. In the near future, additional information will be provided to Nominations geographic unit and Appointments Committees on how to apply this change to their N&A process. Additionally, the vTools.voting and vTools.officer reporting tools will be updated to incorporate the new officer term limitations.

vTools.OfficerReporting enables current geographic unit volunteers to submit officer reporting on-line. Volunteers can enter new officers and view, remove or replace existing officers. Officer names are automatically validated and then updated to the IEEE database. An email confirmation is sent for each submission. Please note that validation is based on business rules per geographic unit type.

Changes to the Geographic Unit Formation Petition Process

The IEEE Member and Geographic Activities Board approved a motion to revise the geographic unit formation petition process for Sections, Subsections, Chapters, and Affinity Groups, effective 1 January 2012, The revisions were developed as a result of an audit of the current process that identified opportunities for more stringent risk management and compliance control.

Petition organizers should be aware of the primary process revisions for petitions to form Sections, Subsections, Chapters, or Affinity Groups. They are:

The petition organizer is responsible for communicating their intent to begin the petition process with the geographic parent's executive committee, prior to gathering signatures on a petition. Prior to submission of the completed petition to MGA staff, the organizer must obtain the signed endorsement on the new geographic unit petition form from a member of the geographic parent's executive committee. This step ensures awareness of the organizer's intent and their willingness to coordinate efforts with the geographic parent.

The organizer shall complete a business plan summary sheet to indicate the planned meetings and activities for the initial six months of the proposed geographic unit. The business plan summary sheet is included on the revised petition form. The business plan form shall include the signature of a member of the geographic parent executive committee, which will the geographic parent's indicate endorsement of the business plan.

Petition signers must have been IEEE members for a minimum of six months.

Required Geographic Unit Compliance

It is important that every geographic unit is compliant with IEEE policy. As a reminder, your geographic unit should not hire staff or independent contractors and shall not lease or purchase real estate without proper Additionally, authorization. separate

incorporation of IEEE organizational units is not normally permitted.

ICX Updates August 2013

A mid-August 2013 release of IEEE Conference Exchange (ICX) integra ted the



conference publication form, which now utilizes information gathered in the original conference application.

In addition, conferences can also register for PDF eXpress or PDF eXpress PLUS using the same publication form. Not only will this provide a simpler process for the conference organizer - IEEE MCE will have a more efficient and smoother review and approval process, while improving communication.

How does this change impact my Conference?

- 1. If <u>Have Not Yet Applied</u> for the IEEE Conference Publication Program
- Once your conference has been approved by IEEE MCE, you can utilize the Conference Publication Form

(http://www.ieee.org/conferenc es_events/conferences/organiz ers/conf_app.html?appName= <u>Publication</u>) to request approval to submit your conference papers to the CPP and IEEE *Xplore*® Digital Library.

oUpon review and approval, IEEE sends you the Letter Acquisition (LoA) after receiving your Conference Publication Form, if you are accepted. The Letter of Acquisition is an agreement between your conference and IEEE to consider

your conference for acceptance into the Conference Publication Program (CPP) and IEEE *Xplore*.

- 2. If you <u>Have Applied, but Not</u> <u>Yet Received</u> the Letter of Acquisition (LOA)
- Conference organizers should not notice any change from their perspective. No further actions or steps are required by you, all information that was previously submitted was brought into ICX and will be used in processing your publications.
- Since you have submitted the publication application already, but have not received a Letter of Acquisition (LoA), IEEE Conference Operations is using that information within ICX and sending you a LoA directly from ICX.
- All PDF eXpress registration requests that were previously submitted will be brought into ICX and used to set up your site.

Are there any other updates Yes! Changes were made that will eliminate errors users have experienced when using Internet Explorer (IE) version 9 to navigate ICX.

Using the eCF effectively manages the digital transfer of ownership rights of the intellectual property to IEEE, while also significantly reducing the time and effort on the part of IEEE authors, volunteers and staff.

Despite these benefits, many conferences have not yet take taken advantage of this important tool. The IPR Office and IEEE Meetings, Conferences and Events encourages all publication volunteers to help celebrate this milestone by spreading the word of the many benefits of the eCF to colleagues and other volunteers who organize IEEE conferences.

Get Ready for Added Hotel Fees

Message from Technical Activities VP

Dear Colleagues,

U.S. President Franklin Roosevelt pointed out, "Competition has been shown to be useful up to a certain point and no further, but cooperation, which is the thing we must strive for today, begins where competition leaves off." While competition among IEEE Societies and Councils can be helpful, it is through our collaboration that we are able to achieve impressive accomplishments.

Societies and Councils build and maintain effective technical communities around technologies. The principal elements of a technical community typically include researchers who develop and advance a technology, innovators who convert the technology into products and services, skilled practitioners who install, maintain, and expand the use of the technology, and educators who expand both the user and the developer base. These are the key functions, but in healthy technical communities, those boundaries are porous, with people crossing over them, and back again, with ease and expertise. The flexibility of those boundaries, and the levels of collaboration, are key markers of success.

One good example is that of our Future Directions Committee. We created this committee to attract emerging communities without being limited by the existing IEEE Volunteers with Future infrastructure. Directions established a broad Smart Grid program that involved many Societies, Councils, and IEEE entities outside of Technical Activities Board (TAB), including Power and Energy Society, which has taken the lead on the program. On the initiation side, we are just starting a Smart Cities program that offers as much, if not more, promise as the Smart Grid program. We also have a portfolio of maturing projects. These communities generate more than 20,000 members who join while initiating or

renewing their IEEE Membership.

We have also seen membership growth, which in turn adds communities and makes existing communities larger. Our Societies have seen a 2.7% growth as of August 2013. Moreover, their work is made easier as many others are making communities that others want to join.

Lastly, we are serving our communities through Open Access to journals. In a recent edition of The Institute, significant coverage was given to IEEE's open access activities. TAB authors, editors, reviewers, and journals were crucial for the success of this activity. We had a TAB celebration in June because our journals had over US\$1,000,000 of open access papers. We have started well.

We are succeeding because we are using our creativity to achieve common goals. The hallmarks of TAB this year have been that we are, each in our own way, pulling in the same direction and achieving success. These successes are no accident; they are the result of hundreds of staff and volunteers working together. We compete to get stronger and cooperate to provide the best benefit to humanity we can.

IEEE MGA Operations Manual Change - Geographic Unit Officer Term Limits

The IEEE Member and Geographic Activities Board approved a motion that limits the number of years any one individual may serve in any one geographic unit officer position. This term limit policy is applicable to the following geographic units: Region, Section, Subsection, Geographic Council, Chapters, and Affinity Groups. Section 9 - Geographic Organizational Units - of the IEEE MGA Operations Manual http://www.ieee.org/societies_communities/ geo_activities/operations_manual/index.html outlines the new policy within each unit type's section of the manual. It states that: "All officers shall not serve in any one position, in any single organizational unit, more than six years in total." The policy also states that "exceptions to this rule require approval by the Region Director who will annually report such exceptions to the MGA Board."

MGA staff will be distributing notifications to those volunteers who are about to reach, have reached, or have exceeded the six year limit in one position in the same organizational unit. In the near future, additional information will be provided to geographic unit Nominations and Appointments Committees on how to apply this change to their N&A process. Additionally, the vTools.voting and vTools.officer reporting tools will be updated to incorporate the new officer term limitations.

All geographic unit officer reporting is to be submitted using <u>vTools.OfficerReporting</u> <<u>https://officers.vto</u> <u>ols.ieee.org/</u>>.

vTools.OfficerReporting enables current geographic unit volunteers to submit officer reporting on-line. Volunteers can enter new officers and view, remove or replace existing officers. Officer names are automatically validated and then updated to the IEEE database. An email confirmation is sent for each submission. Please note that validation is based on business rules per geographic unit type.

Changes to the Geographic Unit Formation Petition Process

The IEEE Member and Geographic Activities Board approved a motion to revise the geographic unit formation petition process for Sections, Subsections, Chapters, and Affinity Groups, effective 1 January 2012, The revisions were developed as a result of an audit of the current process that identified opportunities for more stringent risk management and compliance control.

Petition organizers should be aware of the primary process revisions for petitions to form Sections, Subsections, Chapters, or Affinity Groups. They are:

The petition organizer is responsible for communicating their intent to begin the petition process with the geographic parent's executive committee, prior to gathering signatures on a petition. Prior to submission of the completed petition to MGA staff, the organizer must obtain the signed endorsement on the new geographic unit petition form from a member of the geographic parent's executive committee. This step ensures awareness of the organizer's intent and their willingness to coordinate efforts with the geographic parent.

The organizer shall complete a business plan summary sheet to indicate the planned meetings and activities for the initial six months of the proposed geographic unit. The business plan summary sheet is included on the revised petition form. The business plan form shall include the signature of a member of the geographic parent executive committee, which will indicate the geographic parent's endorsement of the business plan.

Petition signers must have been IEEE members for a minimum of six months.

A green approach?

Parliament Magazine: Why do we need a green approach to IT and what are the environmental problems caused by the digital revolution?

Daman Dev Sood: The world business council for sustainable development has estimated that the number of people on Earth in 2050 will grow to 9 billion (from 7 billion in 2010). IT, which was otherwise thought to be a 'white collared' job and a neat and clean industry, has left a huge environmental footprint. It is a vicious circle too – we need more IT because we have

more people, and then IT grows and we need more people to manage more IT equipment. The importance of green IT lies in the fact that the IT can be greened, at the same time IT can be used to green the rest of the world, that's the power. The digital revolution impacts the environment visibly, heat generated, water used in chillers, electricity used, carbon footprint created, and invisibly, depletion of natural resources like precious metals which are not forever.

PM: In your presentation you use 'the cradle to grave' analogy, which looks very holistic, can you please tell our readers what its main aspects are and why a holistic view is needed?

DDS: A holistic view is required to tackle this challenge as only less than 50 per cent control is directly in the user's hands – the other 50 per cent is not easily visible to the user. This holistic approach has been named as 'cradle to grave' where green aspects of IT equipment are focused at all six main stages, i.e. sourcing-manufacturingpackaging-distribution-usage-disposal. This concept is also known as 'womb to tomb' or 'design to disposal'. Expectation is that a material never goes to landfill, making this 'cradle to cradle' concept

PM: In order to create "Green IT" you point out the need for a balanced approach, why is it important that all stake holders are involved?

DDS: While I truly believe in a balanced approach involving all, this point is debatable and sensitive. Mahatma Gandhi once said "There is enough on this planet for everyone's needs, but not for everyone's greed." If you keep feeding me more, I will keep needing more - I am talking about the manufacturers of the products. Then user is equally responsible - the first action is to and reduce, control manage our requirements. Finally, the regulators must act for good governance. Someone designs, someone provides resources, someone produces, someone packages, distributes and sells, I (the user) use, someone else finally disposes off or recycles. Once we understand this cycle, we can see that we all have a role to play.

PM: Though ICT's contribution towards climate change is relatively small, you have highlighted the huge contribution it can make in tackling the problem. Can you give examples?

DDS: All the automation that has happened in the past 50 years or so due to the invention of IT – falls in this category. More importantly, the Smart 2020 report has good estimates from smart grids, smart buildings, smart logistics, and smart motor systems. One of the easiest examples is from the global giant Dell–switching off about 50,000 machines across globe, when not in use, brought their electricity consumption down by 40 per cent. This was achieved through a simple automation software tool to manage the human dependencies.

PM: What are the main policy drivers globally and within India to deal with e-waste, and from your experience how is India dealing with this problem?

DDS: Globally many steps have been taken like RoHS (restriction of hazardous substances), WEEE (waste electrical and electronic equipment), Energy Star, EPEAT (electronic product environmental assessment tool) and so on. While such labelled products are also available in India, implementation the needs great enhancement, for example, there are not enough collection centres and recycling facilities in the country to actually claim products being compliant to WEEE.

The government of India has paid attention to this challenge and 'e-waste management and handling rules' were made applicable in 2011.

2. Quarterly meet should be organised hub wise, esp one in Delhi, the next outside Delhi,

3. Common email id, where branch chairs can access and communicate

R K Vir Memorial Lecture

First R K Vir Memorial Lecture would be held on January 4, 2014 (9 to 11 am) at National Rail Museum Auditorium, Chanakya Puri, New Delhi.

Speaker: Mr. N. Venkatesan, Former Member (Electrical), Railway Board

Topic: "Electrification and Challenges in Indian Railways"

Chief Guest: Mr. Kul Bhushan, Member (Electrical), Railway Board and *Ex-Officio* Secretary to the Government of India

The event is being organized jointly by IEEE Delhi Section, Institution of Railway Electrical Engineers, Institution of Electrical Technology (IET) Delhi, Institute of Rail Transport (IRT), Institution of Engineers (India) Delhi State Center.

For ready reference biography on Late Er. Raj Kumar Vir is given below.

The name of Er. Raj Kumar Vir has become synonymous with the evolution of Electric Traction popularly known as Electric Trains in India.

He was born in Rangpur (now in Pakistan) and studied in various schools in Punjab (now part of Pakistan).

He was a product of Government College, Lahore and Benares Hindu University (1949, Electrical & Mechanical Engineering) like many luminaries of his period.

He joined Indian Railway Service of Electrical Engineers (IRSEE) in the year 1952 and held various key positions such as Deputy Railway Advisor (DRA) at Zurich, Switzerland. It can be said that he played a major part in transformation of Indian Railways from Steam Days to Electric Traction and hence he was the architect of Modern Indian Railways. He was first ever Divisional Superintendent contributed by the then nascent Electrical Department and one of the first ever General Mangers. He was Divisional Superintendent of Chakradharpur Division in South Eastern Railway, one of the key assignments in view of Iron Ore and Coal Loading and working in Arduous sections. He also worked as Chief Planning officer and Chief Electrical Engineer of South Eastern Railway, which is one of the most important Zones of Indian Railways in view of contribution to Bulk Transport of Iron Ore and Coal and difficult working conditions.

He did a stint as Deputy and Joint Director in Research Design and Standards Organization (RDSO) of Indian Railways from 1966 to 1972. These were very critical years for the 24 volt dc Parallel Block Double Battery System which had evolved on Indian Railways during the last four decades. The train lighting system was very sophisticated and was designed to work automatically except for the function of switching ON and OFF of lights and fans as a group which only required manual intervention. This system was primarily electromechanical in nature and had used a large amount of copper, brass and lead in its various components. mid-sixties these During non-ferrous components had become a target of thefts leading to serious crippling of the train lighting system on entire Indian Railway system. It was under his guidance and a lot RDSO personal contribution that of produced a report on Evaluation of Train Lighting System which formed the basis on which the simplified train lighting system was evolved and is now being followed.

Another very serious problem was the fires in metal body coaches that were being produced by Integral Coach Factory (ICF). His report on fires in metal body coaches was a very exhaustive work on the subject and his personal contribution in getting the changes in coach wiring practices implemented in various coach building units lead to elimination of this problem.

In all the self generating coaches that were in use then, the power generator was driven from coach wheel axle by a flat rubber belt that had a very short life leading to frequent loss of generation due to belt losses. He conceived the idea of mounting the generator on bogie transom and driving it with the help of a set of endless V-belts. It was his personal efforts that lead to the instructions to ICF to produce 50 coaches with this arrangement on trial basis. Today this drive is a standard for all self-generating coaches.

What is more significant is that he has chronicled the developments in his times in most beautiful way in his writings. He has written about involvement of Jawaharlal Lal Nehru, Rajiv Gandhi, Mr. Nouvion and others in his works in Development of Electric Traction little realizing that he himself was a luminary of his times. Among the large number of technical articles written by him for National and International technical journals, his works on 'History of Electric Traction' and on Chittaranjan Locomotive Works stand out. He has in his writings given full credit to his wife Mrs. Chand Vir.

His reach was beyond Electrical Engineering. He was Fellow of Institute of Rail Transport and Institute of Rolling Stock Engineers. He was Senior Member and Past Chair of Delhi Section of Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE) of USA and both a Life Fellow and Chartered Engineer of Institution of Engineers (India). He was also member of Indian National Academy of Engineering (INAE).

Note: It is proposed to hold an Annual event in his memory where in his immediate family members may be invited. The objective is to motivate the young engineers to follow the profession with vision and strive to achieve excellence in whatever they do.
