John Dentler:

- a. Region meeting: 2 candidates for Region 2 directors: Jim Burkhart, Professor at the Cleveland State U; Moshe Camm; Professor at Drexel U, strong candidates. He requested section endorsement
- b. Reported NCAR in a bind due to cost overrun from the SCANNER; They are \$2000 in the red and asked for the region for bail out, but request did not get approval. Suggest helping them; probably as means of generating goodwill. (Randy: think about it, need not to vote on it now). Mel: suggest this be an investment if we are involved, and needs to know why the region turned them down. Chris: Baltimore had bad experiences with NCAR when the two sections tried to publish the SCANNER jointly. He felt that the financial cost of the venture was too much and resulted only in a back page mention of Baltimore sections' help. He cautioned attendees from making the same mistake.

Randy: Salisbury State Student Chapter, propose \$500 for them from the Eastern Shore money; Chapter chairs are welcome to attend or send representatives to the April 10 meeting, but not required.
