3.1 Summary of PACE Conference held in Phoenix over Labor Day Weekend

- Helen Garrison and Rachel Andre, GOLD Chair, attended. Trip reports are due by 30 September.
- Membership Growth and Pre-College (K 12) Education topics are focus for Region 2. Other topics were Improving Communication and Innovation.
- Breakout Session: GOLD
 - Rachel Andre followed this breakout session
 - o Topics included Transition to Management
 - o Communications with Student Members\
 - Podcast is possible Region 1 has Podcast equipment that others can use.
 See Region 1 website for Podcast examples.
- PACE presentations are to appear on the IEEE USA website.
- Regions 1 through 6, all USA, are experiencing dwindling membership Teachers and counselors are not recommending engineering to students.
- Innovation: New products and new business practices need to be advanced.
- SPAC (Student Professional Awareness Conference): Joe Burns is SPAC coordinator. Student-run conference anything but presentations.
- Relationship building between students and professionals. GOLD and Student Chapters to talk to students; is consistent with TISP (Teacher In-Service Program) recommendations but contrary to Region Leadership recommendations.
- Finding Internships for engineering students. Work to improve career search webpage and try to improve by 1 December. Rachel Andre to work with Philadelphia Chapter of GOLD.

3.2 Outbrief of R2 Teacher In-Service Program Training Session Held September 7 – 8

- Bill Semancik and Neville Jacobs lead this effort.
- Approximately 45 people, including educators and organizers, were in attendance. Seven or eight of the 20 Sections in Region 2 were represented.
- Two activities:
 - o Small motor kit demonstrates electricity and magnetism
 - Building a robot arm from miscellaneous components had strongest interest because it is a discovery and innovation based project
- Target spring 2008 for invitations to teacher's in-service meetings; Baltimore County Administrator was enthused.
- Comments from Washington, D.C. schools:
 - o Major changes in education are taking place.
 - o Teach according to standards No Child Left Behind
- Baltimore Section next action: Prepare for future in-service day. Need to identify school district and individuals for contact. Need to establish first contact, including visiting a school district.
- Bill Semancik to start process.

3.3 Status of Communications Society, Computer Society, and Aerospace and Electronics chapters in Baltimore Section

- Communications Society: Thad Welch left and resigned Chairmanship. Julie Medlin is Treasurer and Gary Tartanian is Acting Chair. No activity occurring in the chapter. Bill Semancik took action to contact Brian Womack regarding reviving the Communications Society Chapter.
- Computer Society: Boniface Nwugwo to resign Chairmanship.
- Aerospace and Electronics Systems Society:
 - Chapter has been in trouble for four years; one and a half years of no activity.
 - o IEEE National wants to shut down the chapter.
 - o Brian Womack says that he will work to revive chapter.
- Annapolis Subsection is also in trouble. Bill Semancik to call Noel Castiglia, Secreary/Treasurer, for status information.
- Industry Applications Society is in good shape. Section needs to learn the networking model established by IAS.
