# IEEE Baltimore Section ExComm Meeting 14 December 2009

Meeting Called to order by Dave Kisak @ 18:30 14 Members attending, 0 non-members, 0 students

- Dave Kisak: Reviewed Chapter L31 reports for minimum meeting requirements. As of this meeting 5 chapters not meeting requirements for rebate based on L31 reports. Secretary out of town; Vice Chair to arrive late.
- Walt Willing: Treasurer's report finances healthy and records balance.
- Bill Semancik: Election results for ExComm 2010 Officers, 32 votes received:

  - ➤ Walt Willing Treasurer
  - ➤ John Blake Secretary

Methods to resolve tie: Chair picks winner, Flip a coin, ExComm vote. Motion was made to vote to select method to resolve tie; motion seconded; unanimous vote of ExComm is for ExComm vote by secret ballot among tied candidates. Bill Semancik conducted vote. Allen Pressman wins Vice Chair by vote of ExComm.

- Dave Kisak: Provides status update of 2008 Sections Congress priorities.
  - First priority for 6 free downloads from IEEE Explore will not be approved because of significant revenue loss. 6 free downloads will be sufficient for many current subscribers to from Member Digital Library to end subscription. Expected revenue loss is projected to be between \$1.1M and \$4.0M.
  - ➤ All results are presented on IEEE web page for 2008 Sections Congress.
- Ron Aloysius: Research on Signal Processing Society co-sponsor Norbert Weiner FFT Talks at University of MD. IEEE logo is protected by IEEE. Need to file on-line form for exception.
- Boris Gramatikov: Continuing Education Units (CEU) Programs:
  - ➤ 11/21/2009: Dan Smith, Mentor Graphics; only 8 attended
  - ➤ Dan Smith interested in another 2 or 3 sessions: plan first half of 2010; sessions only on Printed Circuit Board (PCB) design and development
  - Funding request to support 3 CEU sessions on PCB development. Budget includes \$35 per session for IEEE registration (= \$105), \$25 for plaque, and remaining for refreshments. Total budget request is \$350 for 3 sessions. Motion made, seconded, and voted. Unanimous vote for \$350 budget.

• Ryan Janak: GOLD – Introduced himself as Vice Chair for GOLD; Chair Tanner Horner. Walt Willing spoke of \$500 budget available for GOLD. Focus of connecting students to professionals.
