

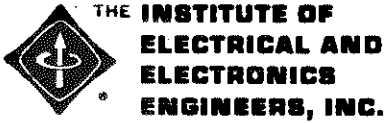

CHAIRMAN'S COLUMN- Region IV Committee Meeting Report

Mr Sanders, Section Chairman, attended the meeting of the Region IV Committee in Chicago, April 23, 1969. The following items summarized the meeting actions.

1. The Sections Committee has been disbanded.
2. A "Regional Activities Board" consisting of the Regional Directors and an elected ~~IEEE~~ Vice-President has been formed.
3. Mr Mulligan, Chairman of the Technical Activities Board, spoke about the activities at length. This committee forms an IEEE contact for the Sections on activities.
4. Passed a motion to form an Ad hoc Region IV Operating Committee to consist of past Section Chairman appointed by the Regional Director, Mr Harry Brunke. Report to fall Region IV committee meeting.
5. David Hodgins, Chairman of Nominations Committee For THE Region, asked for recommendations of interested and qualified members, with resume of experience, to fill Headquarters needs for various positions.
6. Mr Hodgins reported on Survey of "Needs of Members". It gives insight to the strong and weak points in the Section and Institute operations. A copy of the detailed report is available.
7. U. of Wisc. used the Student Branch of IEEE as a contact to obtain an Engineering curriculum. It was effective for the Univ. and promoted an increase in membership of the branch and meeting attendance.
8. Previewed IEEE/Eta Kappa Nu movie "Engineering-The Challenge Of The Future". It was well done and is recommended to be purchased by the Sections to loan to high schools to promote Engineering interest. Cost is listed as \$125
9. IEEE Headquarters pays mileage at 17.5¢/airline mile, one way, to the Regional meetings for 2 trips in a calendar year per Section.
10. Next meeting will be in Cedar Rapids, Sept. 12, 1969 in conjunction
