Student Branches

The IEEE Central Texas Section held its Fall planning meeting on July 23rd where the four student branches prepared power point presentations on their budget proposals describing their projects and activities. UT Austin, UT San Antonio, Trinity University, and St. Mary's University submitted written proposals by the June 30th submission date. They were all found in good order, detailed and documented their request for funds clearly, and fully provided all requested information.

The power point presentations organized and displayed points of information extremely well. The student branches talked up and promoted their favorite and proudest achievements and goals. A projector at the planning meeting was not available. The student branches had to make oral presentations without the benefit of slides and photos, but the reports contained informative and relevant material of interest to the planning meeting. The power point presentations have been circulated among the Section Officers and will be archived with all the planning meeting records. Upon final approval by the Executive Committee, each student branch will be awarded \$1,500. Congratulations!

Trinity sponsors pizza talks which in addition to good technical content also provides for social activities and study breaks. They also make awards to their engineering students and assist them in attending conferences. UT Austin will use a part of its requested funds to maintain its offices as a central meeting place for IEEE members. They are also prominent participants in many regional and national robotics competitions. An outreach plan to teach high school girls to solder should not go unmentioned. St. Mary's will also use a large portion of its requested funds for meetings and social gatherings. But a good amount will go towards recruiting freshmen into IEEE. And some of the funds will be used for field trips. UTSA will use its funds to hold design competitions to get students involved and exposed to different types of electrical engineering. They continue to work with the student government to get a campus radio station operating. And they will continue to hold workshops and tutorials for students to acquire technical support skills.

There has been little rest for the student branch chairs and their officers since school ended in May. They have jobs, internships, and summer classes. Submitting the funding proposal and making themselves available at the Fall planning meeting were additional obligations successfully and conscientiously fulfilled. When school starts again in August, all four student branches will be busily recruiting and retaining IEEE members for their student branches. And there will be the second round of Section funding where the student branches will prepare a competitive funding proposal by September 30th for the remaining \$4,000 available to them.
