IEEE ADDS 15,000 HISTORIC ELECTRON DEVICES ARTICLES TO ARCHIVE

Continuing its plan to digitize its entire journal backfile, IEEE recently made available online versions of more than 15,000 articles from IEEE Electron Devices Society publications dating as far back as 1954. (Additional papers dating back to the 1913 first issue of the journal will be available online early next year.)

The archive now includes articles from three of the Society's most influential publications: IEEE Transactions on Electron Devices (papers from 1954 to 1987); IEEE Electron Device Letters (papers from 1980 to 1987); and the IEEE International Electron Devices Meeting (papers from 1955 to 1987).
