This is a problem for candidates in certain industries; the Bexar Chapter TSPE wants to offer a solution to this problem. Our plan is a three-fold program:

1. Candidates join NSPE/TSPE (as associate members) and attend Bexar Chapter TSPE meetings. When you join, please notify John Brogan with the Bexar Chapter or Timothy Martin with the Travis Chapter of your specialty and needs and he will help with introducing you to the appropriate people in your field.

Candidates get involved in Bexar Chapter TSPE projects and become acquainted with members. In this way, the members can later attest to the character of the candidates.

3. Candidates meet briefly with PE's in their specialty after regular meetings to show examples of their work. By doing this, PE's can attest to the fact that these engineers are doing "engineering work" based on their personal knowledge of the *PE Exam Review* candidate.

How long does this take? The time frame may vary and be dependent on the candidate's presentation of his or her work, amount of experience, and Chapter PE's level of comfort in gaining enough personal knowledge of a condidate to cerve as a reference The
