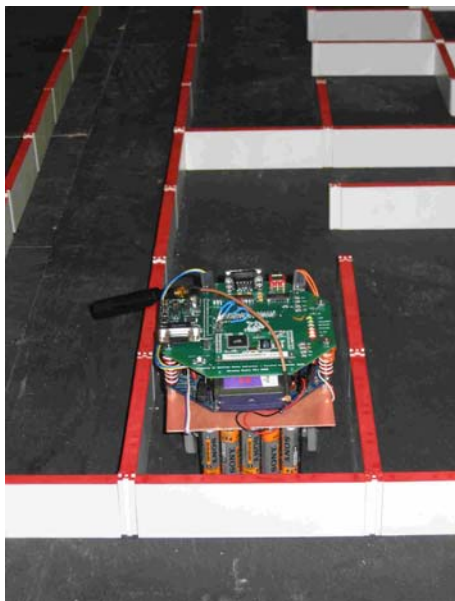


Montana Section News
