

Minutes of the ExCom Meeting on 11/5/08

Chapter Reports:

Vehicular Technology Society:

Clay Maynard who is the Chair/Treasurer presented the details. David Craven is the Vice-Chair and Stephen Foley is the web master. They need more volunteers. So far, they have had only one meeting on May 7, 08 and about 8 people attended the meeting. The topic was "Planes, Trains and Automobiles". They are required to have 2 meetings for survival. There is going to be another talk in Nov/Dec (TBD). In 2009, they are planning to have a talk on 'China's High Speed MegLev". Their membership profile is as follows: Fellows (5), Life Fellows (9), SM (1), LifeSM(11) and Memb (112). It is a joint chapter of SCV(107), OEB(39) and SF(31) members. They have \$16,741.37 in US Bank. They have \$2507.08 in Bank of America. The total funds are \$19,248.45. Inn 2007, they gave seed money of \$1200 to OEB chapter and have not collected it since then.

Consultants' Network (CNSV):

Kim Parnell (Chair) gave the presentation. Vice-Chair: Duane Strong; Director: Dick Ahrons/Brian Berg. Webmaster: Debra Willrett. They have a membership of 133 (IEEE 115, non-IEEE 18). They have an annual membership fee of \$50. There is a \$50 initiation fee. They have \$4357 with IEEE Conc. Bank and \$5461 with KeyPoint Credit Union. They have a balance of \$20,290. Their web site is www.californiaconsultants.org. They have an archive of their monthly talks at their web site. Any site visitor can post a consulting job there. They meet on the third Tuesday of every month at KeyPoint Credit union. They do not meet in July and August. Their membership has steadily grown; 73 (2005), 86 (2006), 109 (2007) and 133 (2008). The board meeting usually precedes the talk. The presentation is from 7:40 to 8:50PM. The attendance is generally 35 to 70. In 2007, they had a talk on "Consulting in Solar Power Age". Some of the talks they had this year were: 1/15/08 Overview of USB; 2/19/08 Wireless Sensors and Control Networks; 3/18/08 Electronics Flow Cytometry; 10/21/08 Effective Communication Skills for Engineers. Tom Coughlin gave a talk on "Your life in your pocket".

Women in Engineering:

Roxsana gave the presentation. She is the Chair, Treasurer and Program Manager. Katie Purcell is the Vice-Chair and Secretary. They need volunteers for office positions in 2009. As of 10/30/08, they have a balance of \$3117.94. There was a technical event on "Conducting Business in China" which was held at Quanta Labs in Santa Clara on 7/16/08. The speaker was Dr. Hong-Sun Li. The attendance was 42 (Members: 20, Guests: 22). There was another event on 9/10/08 at Ramada Inn, Sunnyvale. The topic was "Novel Approaches to Low-Cost Solar Cells: Science and Challenges" and the speaker was Dr. Peter Peumans from Stanford University. A total of 59 people attended (Members: 41, Guest: 18). On 3/18/08, there was an "Expanding Your Horizon" (EYH) outreach event. This was held in UCSC and 250 girls attended the event. EYH began 30 years ago at Mills College in Oakland. This conference is held annually at campuses throughout the US. The goal of EYH is to encourage young women to study math



and science. This is done by showing the benefits of such education to their lives by stimulating their interest in science, technology, engineering and mathematics courses.

Graduate of the Last Decade (GOLD):

San Jose State University: IEEE SJSU Chapter Chair Srinivasa Muddagowni gave the presentation. They have 90 members. All officers are new this year. The very first event was a talk by one of the professors on "Key to being successful in Electrical Engineering". They have had talks from NASA, Space Systems/Loral, Fairchild Semi, Applied Materials, Northrop Grumman and others both from technical and recruiting perspective. Every week the officers meet. Every two weeks, there is a meeting and a talk. They have an annual IEEE BBQ. SJSU chapter also participates in the Micro Mouse competition.

UC Santa Cruz: IEEE UCSC Chapter Chair John Splawn and Vice-Chair Tom Itvarte gave the presentation. Kevin Nelson also contributed to the discussion. This has been a very active student chapter. They have an IEEE member funded bookshelf. They also have a lab for the students to do personal electronics projects. They have to pay \$10 per quarter to use the lab. They have a lot of Agilent test equipment: Agilent 40GSa/s 3GHz scope, 3x 5MHz scopes, 4 work stations, power supplies, Function Generators, Spectrum Analyzers and DMMs. About 7-8 students can work in the lab at a given time. Students get a key code to work 24/7 in the lab. Computer work stations are Quad Core computers. They have added 5 to 10 new members this quarter. UCSC is not involved with the Naval Post Graduate School. UCSC received the Region 6 Outstanding Student Chapter Award. Roger Hoyt presented the Award to all three and also gave them an IEEE T-shirt.

Dan Oprica said that the Keeper of the Flame award will be given to K-12 professor in Math or Physics. Award will be given on 11/17/08 at SEMI open house. In Feb 09, we will give scholarships to 11. Only to students who are applying for engineering.

- Treasurer Report Allen Earman
 - O Current Financials: As of 11/1/08, we have a balance of \$271,487.70. The interest rates in the bank have surged up to 4.8% from the previous 3.14%.



- The projected year end balances are: Dec 08 \$257,266; Dec 09 \$261,516; Dec 10 \$263,816. Allen showed a 2009 Cash-Flow forecast by each month. He showed a detailed 2009-2010 budget. The budget was approved by the ExCom members.
- California Legislative Council of Professional Engineers (CLCPE) Fred Jones
 - This was discussed at the SFBAC meeting since the section has asked for members to all three sections to be part of this.
 - At the meeting in SFBAC, it was decided to have SCV section pay for the membership fee and the council would pay for the nominee to attend CLCPE's quarterly meetings.
 - this is from last month (for reference)
 - CLCLPE has invited IEEE to become one of its members.
 - Annual membership fee is \$2397 but Fred mentioned that we will get a substantial discount.
 - ExCom to vote on joining as a member of CLCPE/not joining as a member. Dick Ahrons wanted to know about IEEE's position on licensing. The ExCom did not vote on it but tabled it.
- TISP Teacher In-Service Program Lee Colby and Tokunbo Ogunfunmi.

 - Started in 2001, TISP features IEEE volunteers developing and presenting technologically oriented subject matter to educators in a professional development or "in-service" setting. In the last several years, IEEE volunteers have made more than 76 presentations to over 1800 preuniversity educators within the United States, Asia and Africa. These educators reach over 185,000 students! There are a number of pre-planned classroom activities that you could use in a classroom setting.

Thanks to the support of IEEE USA and the IEEE Educational Activities Board the event is free for all IEEE members and invited educators!
