Kim Parnell called the meeting to order at 6:08pm.

Kim welcomed the many new officers, including Committee Chairs and Chapter Representatives. He asked that everyone briefly introduce themselves, and they did so. The group received a warm welcome.

### **Minutes of Dec. 2 Meeting**

Kim asked if there were any errors or corrections which needed to be made to the Dec. 2, 2009, minutes as circulated by acting Secretary Brian Berg. Mohamed Sayed made the only comment in noting that one of the motions lacked names of the attendees who made and seconded the motion. Brian said he would correct this oversight and produce a new version.

### **Chapter Rebates**

The rules re: the distribution of chapter rebates were reviewed

1. Remember one of our criteria to receive your chapter rebates is to give a full chapter report for the year.
  2. The rebate checks will be given to the chapters, so please make sure that your chapter is represented at the ExCom meeting to be able to pick up the check if you have not already done so.
  3. As of 1 January 2010, new Rules for reporting attendees at Joint Chapter Meetings (ones that involve more than one society or affinity group) for correct determination of rebates are in effect:
    - All chapters can submit L31s, but only the Host (lead) society or affinity group will be noted in the records of the SCV section for purposes of computing the SCV Section rebate to the local chapters
    - The convention will be the Host (lead) group will be listed first on joint announcements through the e-Grid
    - All co-sponsoring chapters will receive credit for all meetings during the year, but only Host Chapters will get credit for attendee numbers
    - The e-GRID editor and Section Treasurer will take care of all of the logistics for determining Host/Co-Sponsors, including tracking attendance credits
    - This change will affect chapter rebates received in September 2011
- Chair Report – Kim Parnell
    - Antennas & Propagation Society Chapter Update – Paul Harms
      - They have a plan for this year
      - A joint meeting in March with MTT is planned
      - There will be a meeting next week
    - Computer Society (CS) Chapter Update – John Swan
      - CS provided a more detailed report about their revival on Dec. 2, so this is a quick update
      - Rajesh Pendurkar is Chair of the Program Committee
      - Dick Ahrons is on the Advisory Board



- Char Deloche is Chair of the Professional Networking Committee
- Their first meeting with the new officers and committees was on 12/22
- Finding a good venue is still most critical issue
- CS is communicating with other chapters to learn what they do for professional networking, as well as to look for co-sponsored activities; the issue of helping the unemployed often surfaces in these dialogues
- The discussion of unemployed led Roxsana to inquire as to activity John communicated back in November about his activity on the Jobs Task Force. Separately from the CS Chapter, John Swan reported:
  - 80 people showed up at an event that the IEEE-SFBAY Members in Transition LinkedIn Group held in December, presented by John and cosponsored by PACE/ES
  - This LinkedIn group is chaired by CS Chapter Chair John Swan
  - Roxsana asked to be sent info about this LinkedIn Group
- The second meeting with the new officers and committees was on 1/11
- There will be at least nine more monthly meetings starting on 2/9
- John noted that CS is expecting 100-200 attendees at many of the meetings, and told the attendees why he was so optimistic:
  - 3000 on their listserver
  - 1700 SCV CS members
  - Many exciting talk topics
- John requested that their chapter report be delayed by at least two months due to all their changes
- John gave us all a very enthusiastic update
- IEEE-CHM Relationship Update – Dick Ahrons
  - Dick is working on 11 projects with the CHM
  - Rosemary Remacle said the major new exhibit opening late this year will kick CHM up a big notch in world recognition
    - Volunteer docents for this new exhibit will be solicited from
      - over 1100 Life Members and 400 Fellows who live in SFBAC (more than anywhere else in the world); many of these people are retired or are near retirement; many of these are the people were helped make the history that will be shown in the new exhibit
      - readers of an article in e-Grid in late Jan. and early Feb.
    - docents will work 4 hours/week
  - Dick had a conference call early in the year with Computer Society (CS) Executive Director Angela R. Burgess and her staff
    - Angela will meet with CHM CEO John Hollar, and John has contacted Violet S. Doan, Director of CS membership
  - Dick Price, CS Dir of Sales and Marketing, will provide promotion of this relationship in its *IEEE Annals of the History of Computing* publication; Robin Baldwin has been Dick's contact for this publication
  - The IEEE History Center is a joint venture between Rutgers (the State University of New Jersey) and IEEE

- A Motion was made by Dick Ahrons: "IEEE SCV Section to contribute \$5,000 to The Affiliated Historian's Program at the Computer History Museum, contingent upon IEEE's grant of \$10,000 to the program."
- David Craven seconded the motion
- Because Mohamed had only just taken over the Treasurer's job, he did not feel comfortable making any statements about SCV finances
- Mohamed made a motion to table the motion; Kris Verma seconded; this motion passed unanimously
- Rosemary provided some details of the Affiliated Historian Program
  - Prof. Ross Bassett, Ph.D, of NC State, a world authority on the history of MOS, would be the likely pilot Affiliated Historian
  - he would visit the valley
  - IEEE would be the sponsor of his visit
  - IEEE would be allowed to have honored guests at any event that would be held for him
- Dick will create an executive summary of his document for inclusion in the minutes
- IEEE would be given discount rental rates at the CHM
- Rosemary emphasized that this is a substantive proposal from CHM
- Dick and Rosemary got a round of applause
- Chapter Meeting Reports – Kim Parnell

- SJSU Formula Hybrid Update – Mahdi Ashktorab, Matt Kihlthau
  - Mahdi and Matt provided at PowerPoint presentation
  - As a reminder, they are designing, analyzing, building, and testing a formula-style hybrid race car for entry in the 2010 Formula-Hybrid Competition in New Hampshire.

    - or google "Formula Hybrid"
  - They should get to the "Motor Running Under Power" stage by 2/1
  - They noted that their End Goals are
    - Raise awareness and profile of hybrid initiative
    - Build competitive vehicle that is Lightweight and Reliable
    - Offer innovation in hybrid market with Advanced motor controls and Advanced battery management system
    - Win at Formula-Hybrid 2010
  - They currently have 12 sponsors, including SCV
- 2010 New Officer Training – Ram Sivaraman

  - 51 have signed up so far



- SVEC Engineers Week Banquet – Kim Parnell
  - Thu, 18 Feb., Doubletree Hotel, SJ: 5:30
  - It was noted that this event includes Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony of Richard Elkus and Alan Title, and a Keynote talk about the California High Speed Rail Project
  - There was discussion about the number of tables to reserve this year, and whether to invite government officials as has been done in past years
  - After a lengthy discussion, David Craven made a MOTION that SCV purchase four tables for the SVEC Engineers' Week Banquet. Mohamed Sayed SECONDED the motion. It PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.
  - As Secretary, Brian Berg said he would send a request to Elise Engelhardt for the four tables by Friday, the last day for reserving them at \$650 each. Tables of 10 are at this price until Jan. 15 (\$750 each until Jan. 31; \$850 thereafter)
    - Elise can be reached at engelhardte@asme.org or 408.360.0669
    - She will need our list of 10 persons/table with their meal choice (see flyer following) by 10 February
    - Payment can be made with a check to SVEC by 18 February (the event date)
  - Kris Verma offered to form a committee with Ed Aoki and Jack Berg to allocate seats at the 4 tables
    - ExCom Officers are the 1<sup>st</sup> priority, followed by Chapter Chairs, and potentially government officials
    - Ed Aoki said we could get a 5<sup>th</sup> table if needed
  - There was discussion re: how many Scholarships to sponsor
    - Ed Aoki made a MOTION that the Section sponsor one \$1000 scholarship to be awarded at the SVEC Banquet. David Craven SECONDED the motion. It PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.
- Electron Devices Society (EDS) – Prasad Chaparala
  - EDS wants to hold a 3D Interconnect Symposium on Jan. 29
  - It would be free to IEEE members since EDS will get about \$7000 from their sponsor Applied Materials
  - Prasad made a Request for Authorization of full-day technical symposium by presenting a PowerPoint
  - Mohamed Sayed made a MOTION to authorize EDS to hold a symposium. David Craven SECONDED the motion. It PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.
- SFBAC Rep report – Ram Sivaraman
  - As this year the delegate from SCV is the Chair of SFBAC, Allen Earman is Chair of SFBAC
  - Fred Jones, Tom Coughlin and Ram have been attending these meetings
  - Allen will be attending as well
- Status report on 2011 Sections Congress in San Francisco – Roger Hoyt
  - They had a telecom in mid-December
  - Honors ceremony will take place on Saturday night
  - There may be a visit to the CHM
  - Congress will take place at Marriott (the “jukebox”) on Aug 19-22, 2011



- Breakout sessions to be finalized by March
- Logo was finalized
- There will be GOLD and WIE involvement
- The last Sections Congress was held in Quebec in 2008
- Tom Coughlin is chair of entire event, and Roger is the local Chair
- They expect 1200-1500 attendees (Section Chairs attend)
- CNSV Grant Report – Kim Parnell (in John Gale's absence)
  - Next Seminar/Webinar is on Fri, 22 Jan.: *Patents for Engineering Consultants: The Basics, Your Opportunities and Your Risks*
  - 8:30-11:30am
  - Eventually archived versions of the webinars will be available online
- Vice Chair Report – Kim Parnell
  - No additional info to report
- Secretary Report – Brian Berg
  - 2010 Listserver being set up, but I need all the officer info
  - I am soliciting spreadsheets with officer information
  - I will take care of reporting this to IEEE
  - About half of the local chapters have provided their info
- Treasurer's Report – Mohamed Sayed
  - As Mohamed met with last year's Treasurer Mark Hooper only this morning, the financial report that he presented was an unaudited report (see following)
    - Mohamed says he will be on top of things for the Feb. meeting
  - Mohamed needs an L50 Annual Financial Report from each chapter by the end of January
    - Section Treasurer is responsible for submitting the 2009 Financial Report for their Unit, and any Subunits (Subsection, Technical Chapters, and/or Affinity Groups. Units submitting late reports may end up not receiving a rebate payment for their 2009 activities
  - IEEE Investment Fund (investment of \$50,000 of SCV funds)
    - SCV Section joined this as of Jan 1
    - We need to commit funds to Certificates of Deposit at some bank
    - *Input from Allen Earman (who was not present):*
      - *We should transfer these funds prior to the Feb meeting*
      - *Allen recommends that we transfer \$40 - \$50K into CDs*
      - *We should look at banks*
        - *Possibilities include Bank of America, Chase, BB&T Suncrest, etc.*
        - *Wells Fargo has traditionally been the worst for rates*
        - *Jeffrey Pawlan suggested Bank of West, but they do not list their rates online – you have to call them; Jeff should give the phone number to Mohamed*
      - *We should analyze their rates*
        - *If we can get better than 3% we should go for 18 - 24 month term*
        - *If 2.5 to 3%, we should go for 15 - 18 months*



- *If less than 2.5%, we should not exceed 12 months*

  - K-12 – David Craven filled in for Lee Colby
    - got money from Section to buy solar cells, but Lee has put the purchase on hold because of a resistance problem
    - the event has been moved to March
    - they are creating a teaching unit with a solar cell, and something with a motor in it that it will driven
  - Membership Chair – Slava Mach
    - Membership Development (MD) packages to be mailed to chapter chairs
    - Brian Berg is requesting mailing addresses from each chapter for an IEEE mailing
    - He provided IEEE Society membership info (see following)
      - Sections that are growing the most are not in SCV
  - Nominations and Awards Chair – Jeffrey Pawlan
    - Got materials from Roger
    - Will start the push in Feb. or March
    - Someone needs to find an SVEC scholarship recipient
      - Jeff or Roger will handle this
  - SAC Chair & University Student Groups – David Craven
    - He is pulling together info from each of the universities

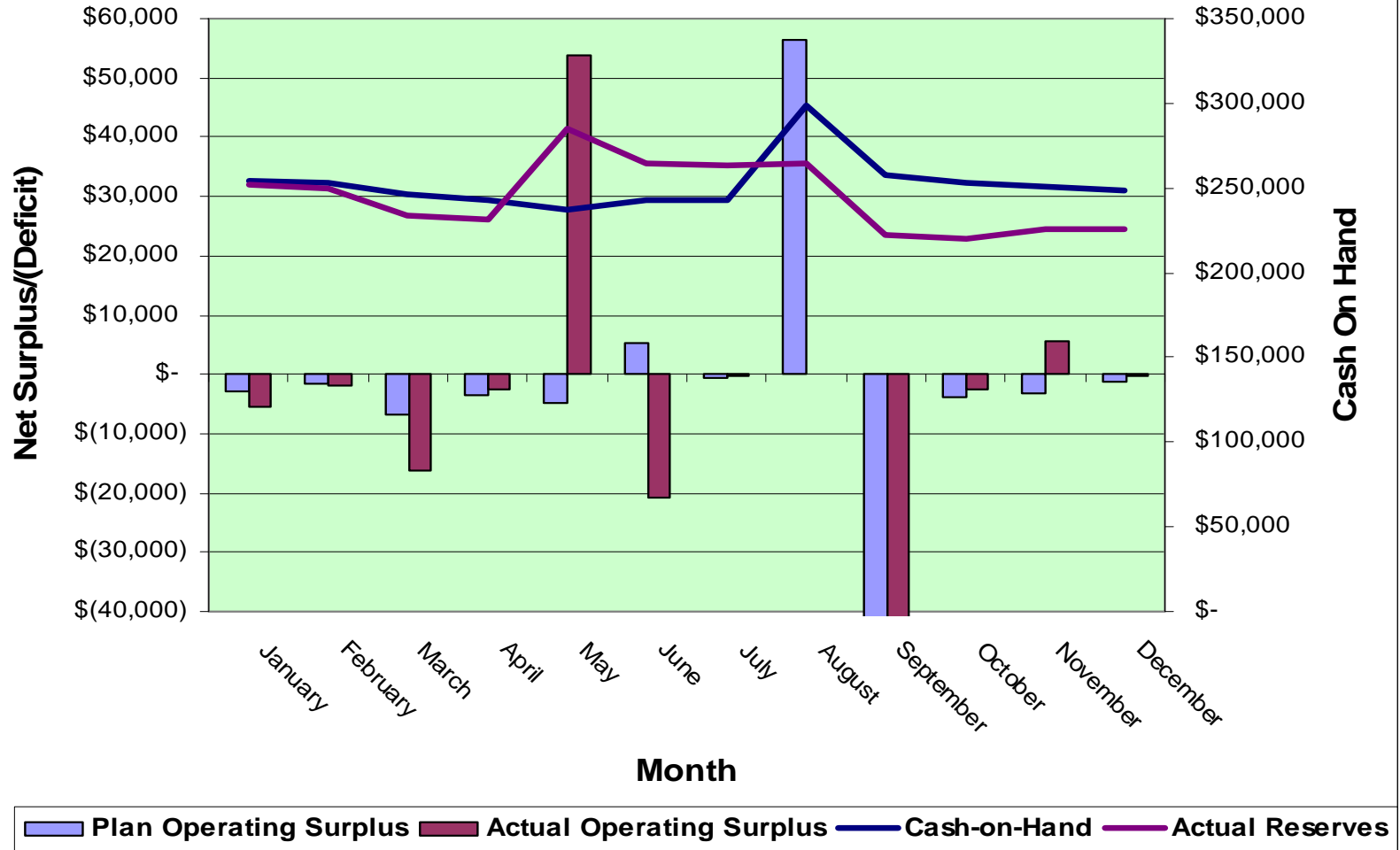
