#### **4. Welcome Address by Region 10 Director, Yong Jin Park**

Director, Yong Jin Park, welcomed members and appreciated Janina Majierska and congratulated Lawrence Wong. He also presented R10 status and its vision of more benefits to members, higher grade membership and more care for sections/chapters.

#### **5. Address by IEEE President, John Vig**

IEEE President, John Vig, shared membership trends, publication, conferences and human resources. He emphasized downsizing of revenue and membership due to worldwide economic slowdown. He also mentioned IEEE 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations, which need volunteers to help local events to calendar listings.

#### **6. Address by IEEE Past President, Lewis Terman**

IEEE Past President, Lewis Terman, emphasized humanitarian activities and inauguration of China office.

#### **7. Address by VP -MGA, Joseph Lillie**

VP-MGA, Joseph Lillie, presented MGA mission and visions. He also implemented member professional home and IEEE relationships with members.

#### **8. Address by R8 Director, Jozef Modelski**

VP-MGA, Jozef Modelski, overviewed activities of Region 8 which are Europe, Africa, and Middle East. He proposed joint events between R8 and R10 such as Sibircon.

#### **9. Address by Moshe Kam on EAB**

VP-MGA, Moshe Kam, addressed the leadership of R10 in the services and programs that EAB provides. It was reviewed what has happened recently and what is planned in R10.

#### **10. Address by Roberto de Marca on TAB**

VP-MGA, Roberto de Marca, mentioned that TA (Technical Activities) contains 38 societies, 7 technical councils and 2 technical committees. He presented 2008 TA revenues and emphasized on new periodicals coming-up and new technology activities.

#### **11. Announcements of R10 SSVR Posters (Norman Marium)**

14 sections selected for SSVR in 2008 showed their activities during coffee break.

#### **12. Reports on R10 Activities in 2008 by past Director, Janina Mazierska**

A presentation was made by Janina Mazierska, past director, who highlighted the following –  
- The membership for 2008 of R10 was 73662, which mean 19% of total members of IEEE.

- The outstanding activities such as 30% MGAB awards and R10 student Gold and WIE Congress were reviewed.

### **13. Approval of Minutes of the R10 Meet in Quebec, Sept. 2008 (Marzuki Khalid)**

Minutes of R10 meeting in September 2008, Quebec, was approved by meeting without amendments.

### **14. Report on the Region 10 EXCOM Meeting in Macau, 10 Jan. 2009 (Kukjin Chun)**

There were no comments on R10 EXCOM Meeting reports held in January 2009, Macau.

### **15. 2008 Finance Report by 2007-2008 R10 Treasurer (Takatoshi Minami)**

A presentation was made by previous R10 Treasurer, Takatoshi Minami, who highlighted the following –

. General resource was 592,053 USD, Expenditure was 517,282 USD and Balance was 74771 USD.

### **16. Audit Report for 2008 Budget (YW Liu)**

Y W Liu reported that 2008 R10 budget was spent properly according to its mission, but he pointed out traveling claims on additional stopover stay and policy of travel expense for delegates.

### **17. Presentation of 2009 Budget by R10 Treasurer (Hang Bong Kang)**

Treasurer, Hang Bong Kang, presented 2009 budget. He tried to make a balanced budget for 2009, but overspending budget was inevitable due to economic situation. The total budget of 2009 was 401,283 USD with 64,423 USD overspending.

### **18. Robert's Rules of Orders (Akinori Nishihara)**

Akinori Nishihara presented the latest version of Robert's Rules of Orders. The order of business, meeting process, regional committee, rules for debate, decision and voting procedures were reviewed.

### **19. Adjournment of meeting (Yong Jin Park)**

Part I of meeting adjourned at 12:20 pm, 28 February, 2009.

### **20. Presentation of Reports by EXCOM Members (I)**

Detailed reports by EXCOM Members will be available at R10 website.

#### **(a) Awards and Recognition (Takatoshi Minami)**

A presentation was made by Regional Awards Committee Chair, Takatoshi Minami, who highlighted the following –

. Bombay section won the 2008 Outstanding Large Section Award and South Australia was

the Small Section Award winner.

- . There were 6 submissions for the Outstanding Volunteer Award for 2009.
- . An overview of the MGA Award in R10 was given.

**(b) Student Activities (Mini Shaji Thomas)**

A presentation was made by Student Activities Chair Mini Shaji Thomas and she highlighted the following –

- . Regular SAC activities such as student paper contests, student awards of 2008 were reviewed.
- . Programs for 2008 were presented; strengthening existing branches & improving the networking.
- . Programs for 2009 were highlighted; GINI expansion and 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary R10 Student Congress.

**(c) Membership Development (Mengqi Zhou)**

A presentation was made by Membership Development Chair Mengqi Zhou. The highlights are as follows:

- . 2009 MD situation was reviewed, which shows a low renewal of membership, average 40%.
- . In order to achieve higher membership increase in 2009/2010, it is strongly encouraged that all section chairs in R10 make full use of MD resources.
- . Incentive program and budget for 2009 was presented.

**(d) Newsletter (Zia Ahmed)**

A presentation was made by Newsletter Chair, Zia Ahmed, who highlighted the following –

- . In 2009, the total 4 issues would be published as well as in 2008, and the deadlines are presented; March, June, September, and December
- . Inputs for newsletters from the each section were requested.

**(e) Electronic Communications (Hidenori Nakazato)**

Hidenori Nakazato, Electronic Communications Chair, presented R10 Website update plan for 2009; face-lift of the front page, more links, additional functionality (search capability, CFP list, Chat or face book, site map)

**21. Presentation of Reports by EXCOM Members (II)**

A total of 5 reports were continued from 14:30 pm to 15:20 pm on 28 February 2009.

**(a) Life Member (Jung-Sun Kim)**

Jung-sun Kim, Life Member Chair, presented current status and goals. The followings are highlights.

- . Current status; 2LM groups (Bombay section, new South Wales section), about 20 sections with more than 10 life members
- . The increasing affinity groups and encouraging LM in R10 are the goal of 2009.

**(b) Strategic Planning (Akinori Nishihara)**

A presentation was made by Strategic Planning Chair Akinori Nishihara. The highlights

are as follows:

- . Strategic Planning of R10 was analyzed in terms of SWOT method.
- . He mentioned Strength (largest number of sections and membership), Weakness (imbalance membership), Opportunity (enhancing networks) and Threats (fewer students studying in IEEE fields of interest).

**(c) Regional Chapter (Deepak Mathur)**

A presentation was made by Regional Chapter Chair Deepak Mathur. The highlights are as follows:

- . One of plans for 2009 is to identify and rejuvenate inactive chapters.
- . Support or incentive for formation of first chapter in newly formed sections was proposed; newly formed chapters in R10 was 28.

**(d) Industry Liaison (Jhing-Fa Wang)**

Jhing-Fa Wang, Industry Liaison Chair, presented vision and 2 awards for 2008 and activities for 2009.

- . 2009 activities; awards activities and more industrial promotion activities

**(f) Regional Section (Norman Mariun)**

Norman Mariun, Regional Section Chair, presented about R10 section status report, officer reporting, section rebate schedule for 2009. Geographic Unit should report meeting activity, current officers, and financial activity.

**22. Presentation of Reports by EXCOM Members (III)**

A total of 4 reports were resumed from 15:35 pm to 16:25 pm on 28 February 2009.

**(a) Women in Engineering (Ramalatha Marimuthu)**

A presentation was made by Women in Engineering Chair Ramalatha Marimuthu. The highlights are as follows:

- . There was R10 Congress in Chennai as well as Woman's congress in Hyderabad.
- . Gender Equal Society Symposium was in 2008.
- . It was reviewed on SANGAMAM Project and WIE manual.
- . R10 WIE Affinity group of the year certificate of honor award and WIE most inspiring engineer of the year award were given in 2008.

**(b) Educational Activities (Proadpran Punyabukkana)**

A presentation was made by Educational Activities Chair Proadpran Punyabukkana. The highlights are as follows:

- . Supports technical colloquium or symposium and a soft skill education were planned.
- . TISP program and an accreditation program in at least 1 country should be supported.
- 1 . At least 1 EAB award recipient from the region by creating EAC awards by the region could be facilitated.

**(c) Technical Activities (Toshio Fukuda)**

A presentation was made by Technical Activities Chair Toshio Fukuda and he highlighted the following –

- . Mission is to promote TA in R10 as a TA coordinator, make the DLP(Distinguished Lecture Program) in R10 more active and refresh colloquium to workshop or seminar.
- . The selection of DLP speakers, tentative 2009 programs and procedures of DLP in R10 were also presented.
- . Budget for 2009 was presented and call for workshop/seminar was shown.

**(d) Regional GOLD (Helene Fung Hoi-Ying)**

A presentation was made by Regional GOLD Chair Helene Fung Hoi-Ying and she highlighted the following –

- . Young volunteers was developed and recommended as candidates for other R10/HQ opportunities.
- . One of goals for 2009 is to establish a R10 GOLD Committee/Working group.
- . The “clustering” experiment might be able to help foster experience sharing of existing gold groups that operates in similar environments.

**23. Presentation of Reports by EXCOM Members (IV)**

A total of 4 reports were continued from 16:25 pm to 17:15 pm on 28 February 2009.

**(a) Regional Conference (Marzuki Khalid)**

A presentation was made by Regional Conference Chair, Marzuki Khalid, who highlighted the following –

- . 6 proposals were submitted for TENCON 2012; China, Thailand, Queensland, Bangalore, Kerala, Philippines
- . Discussion with Region 8 to organize a joint conference between R10 and R8 was recommended.
- . The seed money for TENCON series will be 5,000 USD maximum and normally 30% of the conference surplus should be returned to R10 after the conference auditing, in addition to the seed money.

**(b) Humanitarian Technology Challenge (Amarnath Raja)**

A presentation was made by Humanitarian Technology Challenge Chair Amarnath Raja and he highlighted the following –

- . Expected outcome is to raise awareness of IEEE as “global association of professionals and academics who solve technological problems that positively impact humanity”.
- . The objective is to initiate the HTC programme and bring in awareness of IEEE's plans and directions.

**(c) Global Professional Activities (Y.W. Liu)**

A presentation was made by Global Professional Activities Chair Y W Liu and he highlighted the following –

- . Example of professional activities was announced on a subject.  
(Career management, business services, employment assistance, job-related training and qualifications, financial advantage services)
- . Specific goal of global professional activities was presented

**(d) R10 Advisory committee (Janina Mazierska)**

Janina Mazierska introduced about R10 advisory committee.  
.R10 Advisory committee assists and to advice Region 10 Director and Regional Committee when and where needed, based on acquired regional and corporate expertise and experience.  
.History, vision, advisory committee members and plan for 2009 were explained by her.

**23. 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Plans (Tokyo, Beijing, Bangalore sections)**

3 section Chairs presented for 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary plans from 17:15 pm to 17:32 pm.

**(a) Tokyo Section (Ryuji Kohno)**

The plan is 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary ceremony on October 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2009, at LEVEL XXI Tokyo Kaikan.

**(b) Beijing Section(Ning Hua)**

They will prepare 1<sup>st</sup> all-China IEEE student paper contest in September or October 2009.

**(c) Bangalore Section (Ramakrishna Kappagantu)**

2009 Symposium and Workshop will be held on 29<sup>th</sup> – 30<sup>th</sup> August 2009.

**24. Presentation of Selected Sections for 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration**

3 selected sections Chair presented for 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration plans from 17:32 pm to 17:50 pm.

**(a) Hyderabad program (Rajagopalan Kannan);**

Rajagopalan Kannan proposed 4 activities including a technical program on recent technological advances and applications.

**(b) Bangladesh program(Md. Aynal Haque)**

Main activity is 'IEEE Rally and Seminar' and will be on 10 April 2009, at BUET, Dhaka.

**(c) Thailand conference(Naris Srinual)**

The conference of power and energy engineering for sustainable development will be held on 26-27 Nov. 2009.

**25. Sections' Reporting to HQ (Fanny Su)**

IEEE APO Manager, Fanny Su, presented Status of section reporting. The highlights are as follows:

. Meeting Report; there were minimum 5 meetings.

- . Section and Council Treasurers are responsible for submitting the 2008 financial report for their unit, and any subunits (Subsection, Technical Chapters and/or Affinity Groups).
- . 2009 Rebate schedule;
  - 20 Feb: early reporting for 10% bonus on total rebate
  - 31 Mar: final deadline for rebate eligibility including that of sub units
  - 30 Apr: payouts for section rebates

## **26. Adjournment (Yong Jin Park)**

The meeting adjourned at 18:00 pm.

## **27. Addresses by President-Elect candidates 2010 with Q&A ( Kukjin Chun)**

Kukjin Chun, secretary of R10, organized the addresses of 3 candidates. Each candidate's assertion is as follows:

- . Joseph Lillie; He emphasized new initiative and globalizing professional activities
- . Moche Kam; He emphasized priorities which were seven worthy goals.
- . Roberto de Marca; He suggested guidelines for conduct at meetings and parliamentary rules.

## **29. Rectification of 2009 Budget (Hang-Bong Kang)**

Treasurer, Hang-Bong Kang, summarized 2009 Budget, which the total was 401,283USD with the balance of -64,423USD. The R10 budget of the year 2009 was approved unanimously by the delegates.

## **30. IEEE Korea, Formation of Korea Council (K. Kwack)**

Seoul section chair, K. Kwack, explained the history of Korea and the formation of Korea Council was agreed by all 5 sections in Korea. The proposal for the formation of Korea Council was approved unanimously by the delegates.

## **31. Report on TENCON 2008 (Hyderabad Section)**

A presentation TENCON 2008 was made by Dr. Rajagopalan Kannan. The highlights are as follows:

- . There were tutorials on 18<sup>th</sup> November 2008.
- . Technical sessions were on 19-21 November 2008.
- . 1153 papers were submitted and 487 papers were presented by 348 delegates in 48 oral and 19 poster sessions.

## **32. Presentation on TENCON 2009(Singapore Section)**

A presentation TENCON 2009 was made by Singapore section chair, Ping Lam So. The highlights are as follows:

.TENCON 2009 will be held at Suntec international Convention Center on 23<sup>rd</sup> -26<sup>th</sup> November, 2009.

.Theme is “emerging Technologies for Sustainable development”

. Additional industry tour is requested by delegates.

### **33. Presentation on TENCON 2010(Fukuoka Section)**

A presentation TENCON 2010 was made by Professor Tadashi Suetsugu. It will be held in Fukuoka International Congress Center on 21<sup>st</sup> -24<sup>th</sup>, November, 2010.

### **34. Presentation on TENCON 2011(Indonesia Section)**

A presentation TENCON 2011 was made by Dr. Saleem Tariq. It will be held on 22<sup>nd</sup> -24<sup>th</sup>, September, 2011. Theme is “Methods and Technologies for the next Century” The venues are not decided yet. Two proposed venues are Sheraton Mustika Yogyakarta, Yogyakarta/Bali International Convention Center (BICC), Nusa Dua-Bali.

Section Management director, Cecelia Jankowski, mentioned about section bylaws, creating a volunteer dashboard and IEEE contact center.

Fanny Su, IEEE APO manager, explained what is the essential e-tools and information for section management including petitions for geographical unit formation.

#### **(b) Professional Activities (Joseph Lillie)**

Joseph Lillie, vice-president, presented professional activities. An initiative arose from top 10 recommendations at Section Congress 2008 in Quebec, Canada. He mentioned about MPAC/SPAC (Member/Student Professional Activities Conferences).
