

Minutes of the 2011 IEEE Region 10 Annual General Meeting

5 March, R10 AGM – Day 1

1. Call to Order

R10 Director, Lawrence Wong, called the meeting to order at 8.30am, Saturday, March 5 2010.

2. Roll Call and Introduction

Secretary, Darrel Chong, conducted the roll call and introduced members to the meeting.

All Region 10 Executive Committee members, except Zhisheng Niu (Technical and Conference Chair) and Low Teck Seng (Advisory Committee member), and 60 chairs / representatives of Sections as well as Council Chairs were present. 4. Welcome Address by Region 10 Director, Lawrence Wong

Director Lawrence Wong welcomed all section chairs, council chairs VIPs and Excom members. He presented R10 status and its goals for 2011 and 2012, which are:

- a) To bring more values to members
- b) To empower sections and chapters
- c) To strengthen inter-OU collaborations
- d) To launch new initiatives program.

Lawrence also presented the new Operations Committee (OpCom) structure to the delegates. The new OpCom structure, which consists of the director, director-elect, secretary, treasurer, vice chair for membership activities, and vice chair for technical activities is designed to enable nimbleness to operation and decision making, as well as to facilitate stronger collaboration and accountability amongst R10 committees.

5. Address by IEEE President-Elect, Gordon Day.

President-Elect, Gordon Day also gave an update of the IEEE, the past and present, the top countries with highest membership and IEEE's market share in top countries. The penetration rate in China is among the lowest, showing opportunity for growth there.

6. Address by MGA Vice President, Howard Michel.

Vice President, Howard Michel thanked the delegates for their volunteerism, and highlighted the mission & vision of MGA. He shared about the approaches (landscape) to deliver member benefits, which include

- a) Tactical: Continue to deliver value in 2011, which includes solidifying the membership message, Centre for leadership excellence, vTools, SC11.
- b) In between: Plans to grow and broaden the conference program.
- c) Strategic: Re-invigorate and re-invent geo units. Define (2011), bring together (2012), and implement in 2013.

7. Address by Vice President, Educational Activities, Tariq Durrani

Vice President Tariq Durrani, talked about the possible areas for collaboration, such as

- a) Pre-University Education (TryEngineering.org, Teacher In-Service Program),
- b) University Education (Accreditation, Technical English Program, Real World Engineering Projects, Curriculum Resource Development), and
- c) IEEE Eta Kappa Nu (HKN).

8. Address by Managing Director, MGA, Cecilia Jankowski

Managing Director, Cecilia Jankowski highlighted the retention issue that IEEE faces. The first year retention remains key and MGA is focusing on improving the first year members' experience.

She also shared about the key new initiatives launched by MGA, which include E-membership, myIEEE, IEEE.TV, What's new for student's newsletter, IEEE Press eBooks Classics, IEEE Center For Leadership Excellence (CLE), IEEE Contact Center Improvement, Rupee Payments for students in India, and Xtreme Programming.

9. Address by Division VII Director, Enrique Tejera

Director Enrique Tejera addressed the delegates and encouraged them to join him at the training workshop on day 2 when he will share more about section-chapter collaboration as a means to provide tangible benefits to members.

10. Presentation by Staff Director of Global Business Development & Senior Strategic Planning Manager , Peter Sobel and Helene Fung

Peter Sobel and Helen Fung shared with R10 committee regarding HQ's initiatives to grow IEEE network in Asia.

11. Presentation of Robert's Rules of Order, Toshio Fukuda

Director-Elect, Toshio Fukuda, presented the latest version of Robert's rules of orders. The order of business, meeting process, regional committee, rules for debate, decision and voting procedures were reviewed.

12. Report on R10 Excom Meeting 2011, Taipei, Darrel Chong

Secretary, Darrel Chong, shared with the delegates the agenda, scopes, and key events that took place at the R10 Excom meeting in Taipei, 15 Jan 2011.

13. Approval of minutes of R10 AGM 2010, Cebu, Darrel Chong

Minutes of R10 meeting at Cebu, 27 February 2010 was approved without amendments.

14. Report on 2010 Financials, Hang Bong Kang

2010 Treasurer of R10, Hang Bong Kang reported the 2010 R10 financial statement.

- R10 income was reported at \$437,728.
- Without considering finance set aside for Sections Congress, R10 expenditure was \$323,579, below the budget by \$5,210. However, if we include the finance set aside for Sections Congress (\$127,500), R10 expenditure in 2010 was \$451,080.

15. Audit Report on 2010 Financials, Takatoshi Minami

Chair of R10 Audit Committee, Takatoshi Minami, confirmed that all income and expense are clearly and accurately reflected. He also highlighted that airfares make up a substantial portion of R10 expenses (46.8%, in the case of 2010 R10 meeting) and encouraged the R10 delegates to minimize the airfare by securing discount economy travels.

16. Presentation on 2011 Budget, Michael Ong

Treasurer of R10, Michael Ong reported on the preliminary budget for 2011 and invited the committee members to review the budget in detail and raise any concerns during the presentation in day 1, so that considerations can be made for the final budget approval on day 2.

17. Photo Call

18. Presentation by Membership Activities Committee, Kukjin Chun

Vice Chair, Kukjin Chun, provided detail updates on the membership status of R10, and the recent award winners of R10. He went on to share about the recent unruly formation of sections and chapters in R10, where member names were duplicated in multiple petitions. Moving forward, a revised and tighter procedure (having the involvement of R10 Elevation Committee prior to R10 Director's approval) will be enforced to ensure that submitted petitions are legitimate.

- **Presentation by Membership Development & Life Member Committee, Hang Bong Kang**

Committee Chair, Hang Bong Kang highlighted that this is a new committee, which is a merger between membership development and life member. He presented the 2011 goals and activities, which include

- encouraging growth in higher grade members,
- promoting e-membership, and
- encouraging formation of LMAG.

Budget was allocated to each of the above areas.

- Presentation by Awards and Recognition Committee, Takatoshi Minami**
 Committee Chair, Takatoshi Minami, presented the 2011 goals and activities, and gave mention the following award winners, who then received their awards at the Dinner Banquet on the same day:

 - 2009 R10 Distinguished Large Section Award to Kerala Section
 - 2009 R10 Distinguished Small Section Award to Wuhan Section
 - 2010 R10 Outstanding Volunteer Award to K. Ramakrishna (Bangalore Section), Anil K. Roy (Gujarat Section), and John L. Robinson (New South Wales Section).
 - 2010 R10 GOLD Award to Gowtham Prasad (Bangalore Section)
 - 2010 MGA Achievement Award to Deepak Mathur (Gujarat Section)
- Presentation by GOLD Committee**
 A presentation was made by Committee Chair, Timothy Wong, on the current affinity groups, up to 24, and the GOLD summit that will be held in conjunction with the Sections Congress at San Francisco. 2011 goals and activities were presented.
- Presentation by WIE Committee, Takako Hashimoto**
 Committee Chair, Takako Hashimoto, presented 2011 goals and activities, and highlighted the key programs like STAR and PROGRESS Project (Promote Gender Equal Societies in Science). WIE also advanced women in engineering visibility by being on a panel of APEC, which was held in Tokyo, 19-21 September 2010.
- Presentation by Section / Chapter Committee, James Wang**
 A presentation was made by Committee Chair, James Wang. He highlighted the 2011 goals and activities, and the ongoing effort to ensure the section / chapter formation process is tighten across R10. R10 will work closely with MGA on this aspect.
- Presentation by Student Activities Committee, Takao**
 Committee Chair, Takao Onoye, reported the ongoing growth of student membership and activities in R10. 87 student branch petitions were approved in 2010. More entries were submitted for student paper contest, R10 exemplary student branch awards, and website contests. R10 students also emerged as top winners in global competition. For instance,

 - 5 of the 7 funded projects for Student Enterprise Award were won by submissions from R10.
 - The Exceptional Student Humanitarian Prize (as part of the President Change the World Competition) was won by R10.
 - 2 out of the top 5 IEEE Xtreme Programming competition were won by R10.

2011 goals and activities, including GINI initiative were presented.

19. Presentation by Technical Activities Committee, Marzuki Khalid

Vice Chair, Marzuki Khalid introduced the technical activities committee and highlighted the benefits of taking such an approach. He believed that such an approach will help members to be

more supportive of one another's work and success. He also shared about the recent technical seminars – 2011 R10 DLP Workshop and IEEE Humanitech 2011 that were held back-to-back with R10 meetings.

- **Presentation by Conference & Technical Committee, Zhisheng Niu**
Vice Chair, Marzuki Khalid, presented this segment on behalf of Committee Chair Zhisheng Niu. The major activities for 2011 are outlined, which include TENCON series, providing technical co-sponsorship to conferences in R10, DLP series, and R10 technical seminars.
- **Presentation by Educational Activities Committee, Supavadee Aramvith**
Committee Chair, Supavadee Aramvith, presented the 2011 goals and activities, and provided more insights on the TISP (Teacher in Service Program) and the Accreditation program. At present, EAC is in cooperation with Thailand Section to execute TISP. EAC is still in the process of identifying a section to be focused to drive the Accreditation program.
- **Presentation by Industry Liaison Committee, Rajendra Asthana**
Committee Chair, Rajendra Asthana, reported the goals of the committee. He aims to promote IEEE activities in the industry, to enhance academia-industry collaboration, and recruit more members from the industry. To achieve these goals, Rajendra plans to promote IEEE activities to the industries through awards, and conferences that will be held in R10.
- **Presentation by Professional Activities & History Committee, YW Liu**
Committee Chair, YW Liu, shared that this committee is new from a merger of the professional activities and history committee. To advance professional activities, he presented the proliferation of 'service of free eBook and webinar', whereas for history activities, the three key areas cover EE & Computing milestones, STARS (Significant Technological Achievement Recognition), and global history network (GHN).
- **Presentation by Humanitarian Activities Committee, Amarnath Raja**
Committee Chair, Amarnath Raja, highlighted the 2011 goals and activities, and indicated two focus areas in 2011:
 - Continuous popularization (PR activities) of HTC.
 - Developing a structure for HTAG, which include having an HT coordinator for each section, having an affinity group at each section, coordinating through electronic medium.

The formation of Humanitarian Technology Affinity Group in R10 is endorsed by R10 Director, Lawrence Wong.

20. Presentation by R10 Advisory Committee, Yong Jing Park

Past Director, Yong Jing Park, presented on an overview of IEEE and R10, and therefore, the need for R10 to be better represented at the HQ. Thus, on top of advising the R10 committee, YJ is

committed to assist to increase nominations for IEEE board and committee. In addition, he will be looking into formation of new subsection in Laos.

21. Presentation by R10 Newsletter Editor, Zia Ahmed

R10 Newsletter Editor, Zia Ahmed, thanked the region and section heads, as well as Fanny and Ewell for their support. He emphasizes the importance of the R10 newsletter, and the content that are suitable or not suitable for publication in the R10 newsletter. The newsletter will be published in four regular editions in March, June, September, and December.

22. Presentation by R10 Electronics Communication & Information Management Committee, Jing Dong

Committee Chair, Jing Dong, presented the web structure of R10, and highlighted the goal of vTools, which is provide tools to volunteers to better support our members. 2011 goals and activities, including linking social function like Facebook and LinkedIn to our site, were presented.

23. Sections Congress 2011, Deepak Mathur

R10SC coordinator, Deepak Mathur, reported to the delegates regarding the upcoming Sections Congress, 19 – 22 August, in San Francisco. The number of delegates from R10 in 2011 will be 14 more than in 2008, with the increase from largely subsection representatives. Deepak also covered information pertaining to overview, program, registration, fees, and R10 recommendations.

24. R10 SAC / GOLD / WIE Congress, Om Prakash

R10 Student Rep, Om Prakash, gave an update on the congress that will be held in July in Auckland. This is the first time a congress brings together students, GOLD, and WIE. This congress targets 150 participants and 40 dignitaries, with a theme surrounding 'Emerging Technologies'. Om also covered the program and encouraged all sections to send their potential leaders to the congress.

25. Poster Session by Excom Members

R10 Excom chairs and coordinators put up posters to offer delegates opportunities to ask questions that are specific to their sections or programs.

26. Knowledge Sharing: Presentation by 2009 Large section award winner, Kerala Section

27. Presentation of Awards, Takatoshi Minami & Timothy Wong

Awards presentation at the 2011 R10 AGM Dinner Banquet was coordinated by R10 Awards & Recognition committee chair, Takatoshi Minami. The awardees were as mentioned in section 18b of the minutes.

28. Presentations on possible venues for R10 Excom and R10 AGM 2012

5 venues (Bangkok, Colombo, Calcutta, Hyderabad, Tokyo) for R10 Excom and R10 AGM were presented.

29. Close of meeting – Day 1

6 March, R10 AGM – Day 2

30. Call to Order

R10 Director, Lawrence Wong, called the meeting to order at 8.30am, Sunday, March 6 2010.

31. Rectification of 2010 Budget, Michael Ong

The R10 Committee approved the R10 budget of US\$596,290, of which US\$235,990 (40%) will be planned for Section Congress expenditure.

32. Executive Agenda, Lawrence Wong

No issues were tabled for the executive session.

33. Report on TENCON 2010, Fukuoka Section

Fukuoka Section presented a report on TECON 2012. The TENCON was held at Fukuoka International Congress Centre, 21-24 November 2010. The number of submission was 695, with a 84.3% acceptance rate. The number of participant was 560. The conference surplus was US\$21,187, of which 30% (US\$6,356) will be shared with R10.

34. Presentation on TENCON 2011, Indonesia Section

A presentation TENCON 2011 was made. TENCON 2011 will be held at Bali (Inna Grand Bali Beach Hotel, Resort & Spa), 21-24 November 2011. The theme of the conference is "Trends and Developments in converging technology towards 2020". The topics, program overview, registration fee, and targeted number of attendees were presented.

35. Presentation on TENCON 2012, Philippines Section

A presentation TENCON 2012 was made. TENCON 2012 will be held at Mactan Island, Cebu, 22-25 November 2012. The theme is "Sustainable development through humanitarian technology".

36. New Business / Other Matters

- **Statement of Concern**

Dr. Arkadiusz Dadej, Australia Council Chair, raised a statement of concern calling for the R10 Excom to review its TENCON location selection process. R10 Excom received the feedback well, and responded accordingly to Australia's concern. The statements are replicated below:

"The IEEE Australia Council wishes to express its concern and dissatisfaction with the process of awarding organization of TENCON 2013, where new bids have been solicited after the advertised deadline, without the bid from Queensland section, submitted in time, having been evaluated and decided upon prior to additional bids being sought."

“We call upon the R10 Executive Committee to ensure that future selection of TENCON organizers is fully transparent, fair to all bidders and conducted in accordance with the procedures advertised to all bidders.”

- **R10 Logo Contest:** Zia updated R10 and showed the delegates the entries for R10 logo contest. After evaluating the submitted logos against the criteria that were determined by the judges, the panel decided that none of the logos qualify as the winner. As a result, no winner will be identified for the contests. Nonetheless, Zia was requested to send a thank you note to the participants to appreciate their involvement and enthusiasm.

37. Training Workshops

The training workshops consist of two breakout sessions. One session was designed for new chairs and the other was for experienced chairs. Both sessions began with general feedback sessions, to allow delegates to raise questions, concerns, and suggestions on running of sections. The session facilitators are Membership Development & Life Member Coordinator (Hang Bong Kang), Vice Chair for Membership Activities (Kukjin Chun), and Vice Chair for Technical Activities (Marzuki Khalid). The summaries of the feedback sessions are highlighted in the next segment.

In addition to the feedback sessions, training sessions were organized to provide delegates with new knowledge. The trainers are Section & Chapter Coordinator (James Wang), Division VII Director (Enrique Tejera), and Vice President of MGA (Howard Michel).

- **Section Chair: Quick Start Training, James Wang**
Section & Chapter Coordinator, James Wang, shared with new chairs the basic 101 of running a section effectively. He introduced the general structure of IEEE, how it is organized and what IEEE stands for. Next, he touched on the key areas to look out for in order to run a section effectively. Those areas involve:
 - Organizing the section / chapter officers.
 - Setting up the calendars
 - Preparing reports and applying for rebates
 - Winning section awards
 - Organizing section activities
 - Informing members about section activities.
- **Sections and Chapters working in close cooperation: ‘The way to go’, Enrique Tejera**
Division VII Director, Enrique Tejera, dived deep to explain the relationship between MGA and TAB (Technical Activities Board), and the functions of TAB, divisions, societies and councils. He also took the opportunity to cover the following areas:
 - Actions from sections to promote chapter activities
 - Responsibilities of sections and chapters
 - Financial resources for sections and chapters

Enrique ended the training by making suggestions on how chapters and sections can provide benefits to the membership. Some of the suggestions include – making use of the Distinguished Lecturers Programs, identify where the potential is for formation of new

technical chapters, and establish programs to recognize outstanding members in the technical fields.

- **Nuts and Bolts of Local Operations. Engaging the members, Howard Michel.**

Vice President of MGA, Howard Michel, took this time to engage the experience chair on the shifting membership model of MGA. In the past, engaging the members meant more meetings. The new model presents a changed paradigm. Meetings must first meet the needs of members. This can be achieved through providing benefits that are relevant to members' life-cycle. Howard went on to share on the following:

- The top 10 importances / satisfactions / gaps for higher grade members; observations and conclusions.
- Life Cycle Portfolio grid.
- Retention vs. Recruitment rate

38. Breakout Summary

Kukjin Chun, Marzuki Khalid, and Hang-Bong Kang presented a summary of their feedback sessions. The key take away from each of the session were:

Membership Feedback session (experienced chairs) – Key Takeaways:

- IEEE should not be priced as an 'exclusive' organization for the wealthier individuals who can afford it.
- E-membership option may not be well publicised to current and prospective IEEE members.
- Volunteers want to understand what the tangible benefits of IEEE to members are.
- Section's support for IEEE students and young professional events is important.
- MGA needs to communicate with sections the correct application process for forming new chapter /subsection.

Membership Feedback session (new chairs) – Key Takeaways:

- Concentrate on GOLD members to increase membership
- Reduce membership fee to students. Consider e-membership?
- Collaborate with the industry to recruit and retain members.

Technical Activities Feedback session - Key takeaways:

- Too many conferences in R10. It is difficult to ensure quality.
- Who is responsible to ensure that conferences / co-sponsored conferences meet quality?
- Who conducts post-conference quality assurance of published papers?

Region 10 Director, Lawrence Wong, closed the meeting at about 12pm.
