- The number of members increased by 6.7% to 63548 as of 31st Dec 2004.
- As of Feb 2005, R10 lost 21310 members after the 2004 drop in student members.
- The R10 target of 5% growth for 2004 was achieved as 6.7 %.

(b) Student Activities Committee (SAC)

A presentation was made by Student Activities Committee Chair, M Khalid, who highlighted the following:

- He introduced R10 SAC Committee 2005.
- Top ten of large Student Branch (SB) was reported by Table.
- Pune Institute of Computer Technology is the largest SB in R10.
- Major activities and awards in 2005 are:
 - a) Student Paper Contest 2005, which is in review process.
 - b) Student Best Website Contest 2005, which is in review process.
 - c) Selection of Larry K Wilson Award 2004, best student volunteer of the year.
 - d) Selection of Outstanding SB Award 2004.
 - e) Outstanding Student Branch Counsellor & Advisor Recognition Award and AT&T Award are announced.
 - f) Numerous Student Awareness Activities will be planned.
- There are 361 Student Branches in R10 as of December 31 2004, which is the largest in IEEE.
- There are 47 inactive Student Branches with less than 10 members (9 with 0 members).
- Beijing, Bombay, Delhi, and Western Australia are submitting for R10 Student Congress 2006.

- Finally, she introduced action plan for 2005.
