A question often heard is, "What is IEEE doing for the member?" It's a good question, and answering it usually brings the response, "I didn't know all of that." A corollary question is, "How can I help IEEE be more meaningful?" I'll take this opportunity to review some of the answers to those questions.

Members volunteering – making a difference

Volunteerism is the core of our slogan that "IEEE is the Member and the Member is IEEE". More than any other professional engineering organization, IEEE is led by its volunteers. The path followed by many starts with a section or chapter office, followed by area/council positions and Region activities. We are always on the lookout for new volunteers. Past surveys show that most members start volunteering because they were

asked by a colleague. For the many sections that have unfilled positions on their Excom, giving some thought to asking colleagues to fill a position could pay dividends. Starting with a small request oftentimes gives satisfaction to the new volunteer so that s/he will respond to another call to fill a different need later. If you have been through the chairs at section and area/council level, your experience and insight will be useful at the Region 3 level. Let a member of the Region 3 Excom know that you would be open to another assignment.

Officer updating

As we approach our Fall Region Meeting in Birmingham (October 26-28), Sections will want to be sure that they have representation there. Travel for one delegate per section will be funded by Region 3. Sections are welcome to send additional members, at sections' expense. See the recent announcement. But soft-skill training is needed as well, especially with the elimination in many corporations of the middle management layers that formerly provided most of the mentoring to engineers. Best Practices as a resource

A compilation of Best Practices can aid chapter/section officers as well as those further along in higher offices. We need to collect the experiences of volunteers on what works for planning meetings, field trips, local tutorials, job fairs, pre-college interaction and other events. What went well? What attracted the members? What could be improved for next time? One area where best practices can be very helpful is in planning PACE projects, such as S-PACs and Member Professional Development Seminars. I hope you will share your experiences with us between now and the Birmingham meeting, where the topic will be discussed further. The small amount of time required to document a project can pay big dividends to your fellow volunteers who may want to use your experience as a recipe for a similar project in their section.

Awards and Recognition

Recognition of our volunteer leaders is one way of rewarding them for a job well done. At the IEEE-USA Awards and Recognition Program held in Scottsdale earlier this month, we had several Region 3 awardees. Carl Hussey received a Regional Professional Leadership Award for promoting PACE activities in Region 3. Grayson Randall received the IEEE-USA Citation of Honor for inspiring pre-college and college engineering students in the area of robotics. Key staff from a Central Florida television station, WESH 2 News, received an award for distinguished contributions furthering public understanding of the profession, from accurate reporting in the Return to Flight series, chronicling the contribution of engineers to the space program.

In all these cases, as with section and Region 3 awards, an IEEE volunteer started the ball rolling by nominating potential recipients. Our Awards and Recognition chair, Mary Ellen Randall, has done an outstanding job in processing nominations, but we all need to support her by pointing out meritorious award candidates. Sections Congress 2008

Region funding allocations will be increased in 2008 – for the first time since 2003. For Region 3, this will amount to an additional 18 percent. Funding for Sections Congress 2008 will be increased by \$100,000 overall - \$3,315 for Region 3. Sections should be making plans in their 2008 budgets to fund their contribution to SC08 and to identify their delegates who will travel to Quebec City to participate. www.ieee.org/sc2008 Remember that a valid passport will be required to travel to Canada.

Organizational Advances

In January 2008, the name of Regional Activities will change to Member and Geographic Activities, as the focus for member activities becomes totally centered within our organization. Director-elect Bill Ratcliff has been very active in the group planning the organizational transition, and will be giving us an overview of it in the Birmingham fall meeting.

The cutover to the new Business Management System has been accomplished for membership renewals in the present cycle, and further enhancements will be forthcoming. The SAMIEEE membership database will change, with some new features. There is a continuing series of Live Meeting presentations about the SAMIEEE changes, and I hope all volunteers will take advantage of them to learn the new capabilities.

Finally, a reminder to vote before the end of October, to be sure your voice is included in selecting IEEE leadership. Given that fewer than ten percent of our members usually vote, you have good leverage for your selections. You CAN make a difference!

Newsletter Article About Newsletter Articles

Did you notice that our regular newsletter is no longer sent to the entire region? The communications committee has been working to find the right balance between reaching out to the member and supporting our organizational units. We currently limit distribution to the Region 3 committee, which included section chairs, and selected section volunteers, such as communications chairs, newsletter editors, and webmasters. Additional chairs are added based on the content submitted for publication.

At our last Region 3 meeting in Richmond, you demanded we let the sections communicate with their members. Among other things, you were concerned with the deluge of information from IEEE raining on your members. Communications is a two way street and this was our turn to listen.

We found the content submitted focused on volunteers and in some cases only section chairs. So this seemed like an appropriate approach. So we have passed the buck to you. As my Brigade commander used to say, "No guts, no glory." We have provided a mix of material; some is narrowly focused on specific volunteers and some is important for all your members to hear. You are in the best position to know which tidbit falls into which bucket. Please read our newsletter with this in mind and pass the appropriate tidbits to your membership.

Our hardcopy newsletter costs about \$12,000 a year to mail to all 30,000 members. Is this the best use of our scarce funds? We need you to decide. Members out of reach of our e-notice system are becoming nearly extinct. We obviously need to use the postal service to reach those members who have opted out of e-notice. But what about the others, members with electronic mail who have chosen to receive electronic notices? Announcements for our regional conferences, SouthCon and SoutheastCon, need to reach all members and have been a primary driver for mailings in the past. Last year's SoutheastCon sold out on electronic notices alone. The additional registrations received after delivery of the hardcopy version did not come near netting \$12,000.

So what do you think we should do with that \$12,000? It's your budget. You decide. Lets resolve it in Birmingham.



