MGA Challenge

- The 2010 MGA (Member and Geographic Activities) Challenge solicits proposals for projects that will deliver tangible member products, services, and increase the value of IEEE membership in 2010
- Evaluation criteria includes but is not limited to:
 - Ability to increase the value of IEEE membership
 - Pilot project can be implemented in 2010
 - Breadth of member impact (e.g. across geographies, member lifecycle, and/or industry sectors)
 - Budget \leq \$25k

Region 3 MGA Challenge Proposal

- Purpose of the proposed Region 3 program is to develop a coordinated industry relations contact and employment assistance/career development program
- Proposal prepared by Bill Harrison and Ed Kirchner
 - Submitted on 2 April 2010

R3 Program Overview

- The program intent is to train Region IEEE members in delivering employment assistance/career development services through companies that employ IEEE members
 - Develop effective training materials and a “train the trainer” program working in conjunction with the IEEE-USA Employment and Career Services committee
 - Identify target companies (employers with a high percentage of IEEE members or prospective members) and work towards establishing a relationship with the companies
 - Have trained IEEE members deliver services to members through their companies
 - e.g lunch time meetings

Program Highlights

- At least six of the 41 Region 3 local sections and areas will participate in initial pilot efforts
- Goal for the first year is to complete at least 2 in-house training programs, and gain feedback from all involved parties to determine if the program should be rolled out on a larger, i.e. to other Regions, scale
- Required MGA first year funding requirement is estimated to be \$24,600
 - Mostly travel expenses

Action Plan

- Telecon held 6 April to develop action plan
Conclusions were:
 - Bill Harrison and Ed Kirchner will be project co-leads
 - The first three target areas for the pilot program will be
 - Atlanta Section
 - Melbourne/Canaveral Sections
 - Piedmont Section
 - Another area which may be a near-term candidate is the Huntsville Section

Action Plan

- Preliminary discussions with the candidate areas will begin immediately
 - Ed Kirchner has contacted Melbourne and Canaveral
 - Bill Harrison presented the project at the 22 April Atlanta Section Annual Banquet Meeting – volunteers expressed interest in participating
 - Lee Stogner will introduce the proposal to the Piedmont Section
- A survey will be set to all Region 3 members to ask relevant questions about potential IEEE employee assistance and career development efforts

Action Plan

- Contact with Region 3 employers will also be initiated in the pilot areas
 - Ed Kirchner initiated discussion with Harris Corp senior engineering management
 - Lee Stogner discussed the company database he has access to, and took an action to provide database extracts for the pilot areas
 - Lee also discussed potentially incorporating Corporate visits into his itinerary of visits throughout Region 3

Other Developments

- Follow-on telecon held 28 April
 - Lee Stogner suggests having “train the trainer” program at Fall meeting in Atlanta
 - Prior to that meeting, program will be executed in the 3 identified high-need areas
- ECS committee telecon on 4 May
 - Ed Kirchner will introduce the program to committee members
- No word on status of proposal
 - Region 3 will continue to work the action plan
