## Section activities this year:

Jan. 12<sup>th</sup>: Section Life Members meeting. Mr. Howard Kan presented on the topic of "Latest in hearing aid technology".

Jan. 20<sup>th</sup>: Regular section meeting. Michael Brothers, the Director of the Marine Science Center at Ponce Inlet, gave an overview on the Marine Science Center.

Feb. 22<sup>nd</sup>: Section Computer Society event. Dr. Stanislaw Raczynski from Panamericana University in Mexico City gave a talk on "Attainable Regions for Flight Trajectories".

Feb. 23<sup>rd</sup>: Regular section meeting. Dr. Micah Blackmon from the Halifax Health Center for Urology made a presentation on the daVinci Surgical Robotic System.

On Jan. 29<sup>th</sup>, our section participated in the Annual Tomoka Region Science Fair at Atlantic High School. This year, our section gave two IEEE special awards, one for the junior division and another for the senior division.
