Introduction

Member Engagement Activities:

e-Membership

Jamaica Section Activities:

Jamaica Section Bid Proposal for SoutheastCon 2015.

Following Southeast Con 2011, the updated Bid Proposal for Southeast Con 2015 was submitted and reviewed by members of the Region 3 Conference Committee in San Francisco to further examine and develop a budget for SoutheastCon 2015. The committee provided an excel spreadsheet to be used for creating this budget and the Section has agreed to submit the completed spreadsheet. James M. Conrad, PhD, PE, PMP, Associate Department Chair and Associate Professor, Dept. of Electrical and Computer Engineering, UNC-Charlotte, NC, jmconrad@uncc.edu, has agreed to serve as our "mentor".

The presentation at last month's Section meeting was entitled 'JAMNAV-VCS: Bridging the GPS navigation and GPS tracking platforms' was presented on September 21, 2011 by the Mona GeoInfomatics Institute, at the UTech Faculty of Engineering. This event was well supported by members and guests.

ComSoc

Planning started for the PACE Activities for this year with a special meeting by the PACE Chair, Dr. Halden Morris on Monday June 13, 2011. However, the plans for the PACE activity for this year has been put on hold until next year when the Section will hold another successful workshop.

Student Activities

The Student Branch of the University of Technology (UTech), Jamaica, remains committed to the ideals of the IEEE and we are in the process of identifying candidates for the post of Student Branch Councilor. Mr. Vincent Hewitt the longest serving Student Branch Counselor in the IEEE Jamaica Section (since 2001) has indicated that he will not be continuing to serve in this capacity.

The Student Branch is also in the process of planning their SPAC for early next year.

Education Society

Last year the Jamaica Section started an Education Society and meetings were held jointly with the Section. It is anticipated this society will have regularly scheduled meetings this year.

Power Society

The Section also started the process for creating a Power society in the later part of 2010. There has been a great deal of interest in this area and it is anticipated that this year it will be officially formed.

Consultancy Affinity Group - Jamaica

The group was approved on December 30, 2010. Note that no activity was undertaken during the year except the workshop/seminar on Consultancy in October at which this group was formed. The financial activity for this event is reported through IEEE Jamaica Section.

Webmaster Milverton Moore continues to keep the website current and provides valuable information for the Jamaica Section and Region 3.
