- Increase awareness of IEEE humanitarian activities (IEEE President's Change the World Challenge, IEEE Humanitarian Challenge, IEEE Humanitarian Conference, Engineering4Change, EPICS, etc ...) via our sections and annual conference
- Humanitarian Competition at Conference open to student and IEEE member competition at Region 3 conference - open innovation in using technology for humanitarian programs either in a local community settings or global humanitarian challenge (steer winners to IEEE programs for implementing and engage IEEE members in implementation, ask IEEE members to help judge competition)
- Invite speaker to Region 3 conference from an IEEE humanitarian funded project

 OBJECTIVE: Create a team that would focus on disaster preparedness, and support established Federal and local programs.

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 RESOURCES NEEDED: Pre-established connection with the Red Cross. Known areas of specialization/capabilities (Power, Grid, Electrical Safety, Communications [HAM])

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 PEOPLE NEEDED: Members with Power, Communications, and Safety expertise. Search IEEE database. IEEE website, email, and newsletter solicitations. Red "R"

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MEASURE SUCCESS: Number of members involved in (1) organization, and (2) execution. New recruitment from organizations related to the Power Industry, Inspector associations, and HAM radio community. Increased public awareness of IEEE community as a community resource.
