AREA 9 REPORT FOR APRIL 23, 2012, REGION 3 EXCOM

Introduction

Monthly Section Meeting

This month the Section plans to have a Technical Presentation entitled: Edutainment & 3-D Multimedia in Education presented by Dr. Damith Wickramanayake, Mr. Lushane Jones and Mr. Rushane Jones.

UTech Student Branch

The team of 14 University of Technology (UTech) Student Branch members returned home to Jamaica after a successful trip to SouthEastCon 2012 Student Competition where they participated in all six competitions and received four awards.

UWI Student Branch

University of the West Indies (UWI), Mona Campus also participated in the student competitions at SoutheastCon 2012 after several years of being absent from SoutheastCon. For a few years the Branch was not active however it was discovered in February that the Branch was never assigned a Student branch code and they were not listed among the student branches. This year, several UWI students joined IEEE and paid their dues. The student branch successfully completed and submitted a petition to be recognized as a student branch which allowed them to participate in SoutheastCon 2012.

The UWI Student Branch was launched originally in the year 2002 and participated in SoutheastCon2002, April 5-7, 2002.

e-Membership

Jamaica is eligible for the IEEE e-membership programme.

The members who had not renewed this year, members who were found to be inactive and other interested persons were contacted by email last month to extend to them the opportunity to utilize e-membership and also the offer to pay half the price for membership for the remainder of the year. We plan to continue to focus on this membership drive during the remainder of the year to improve our membership.

The Hilton confirmed that the dates for the Conference are available and have submitted a proposal to the Section. The committee is now in the process of reviewing the proposal which appears favorable.

At present the Section has a few core persons who are members of the ExCom that are very active, however, there are positions within the ExCom that need to be filled and the challenge is to have other IEEE members take on these leadership positions.
