Monthly Section Meetings

On Wednesday September 4, 2013 the Section had a presentation by IEEE Student Branch member, Kristoff Howell entitled: "Robot Design Review for SoutheastCon 2014". The meeting was held at the Department of Physics, Faculty of Science & Technology, University of the West Indies (UWI). A student at the University of Technology and member of the robotics team at SoutheastCon 2013, Kristoff did an in-depth presentation on the requirements for the 2014 robot and recommendations on the design.

On Wednesday July 17, 2013 the Section had presentations at the Faculty of Engineering, UTech on two research papers:
