Resources Needed


- 1) Working with the Director and PACE chair to coordinate funding to help Jamaica to host a S-PAC next spring.

What's an SPAx?

- Pronounced "spa ex"
- SPA still stands for Student Professional Awareness while the x is the variable students decide how to present.
- It is limited only by their imagination and being able to show how it advances the students professional awareness.
- It can be anything from a traditional conference or venture (S-PAC or S-PAVe) or an experience, techtalk format, competition, workshop, expo, seminar, webinar, industry visit, humanitarian field project, or informal social activity focused on professional skills development.



What's an SPAx?

- Students can explore and customize their event to meet the professional needs, expectations, and interests in a way that suits their specific branch as long as it relates to at least one of the eight SPA core areas:
 - Career Development
 - Professional Integrity
 - Personal Skills
 - Engineers and Public Policy
 - Leadership in Professional Organizations
 - The Practice of Innovation
 - The Art of Communication
 - Humanitarian Grand Challenges
- Each SPAx and would have to be approved by Student Professional Awareness Committee.



What's an SPAx?

- SPAx tagline Explore. Engage. Experience.
- Initially announced on 8/7/14.
- Should be ready to be fully deployed in January 2015 with revamped website.
- Students can start hosting them now.



How can I help with an SPAx?
