MOVE: In a Nutshell

- For Disaster Survivors
- Who have survived the initial catastrophe,
- MOVE (MObile VEhicle)
- Is an IEEE Project that creates and operates a vehicle for disaster relief
- That provides needed communication & power support to victims
- Unlike some Responder Efforts providing communications support to disaster response infrastructure (e.g., ARRL ARES, CISCO NERV)
 - Our project is focused on <u>help to disaster survivors</u> by supplying valuable services until normal infrastructure is restored.
- Additionally it energizes the IEEE volunteer base, highlights skills, promotes public awareness and more



Validation: Focus Groups For Super storm Sandy

- Felt isolated Called relatives with cell phones
- Lacked knowledge of current conditions
- Lasted 10-12 days
- Night darkness caused concern for safety
- Lacked knowledge of services available
- Unnerving



Goals

Provide communication, energy, light & information to disaster survivors

- Give comfort to survivors
- Provide communication, energy, information & light to disaster victims
- Educational outreach to STEM students & Public
- Engage IEEE Members through project involvement utilizing their technical skills
- Share results widely, adapt to other IEEE Regions
- Promote IEEE



Means to address Goals

- Communications: Internet access via an extended WiFi network (Mesh architecture, range extenders, bridges, ???) and a satellite ISP
- Light and communications: Power bank to recharge hand-held devices, with flash-light capability and solar charger
 - Give away units from MOVE & Red Cross vehicles
 - Recharge (5V DC) on MOVE vehicle after exchange
- Information: Video displays with local (off-air) and national news (Sat. TV), official info from Red Cross and Incident Commander

American Red Cross partnership

- MOVE Deployment by ARC request at ARC Emergency Shelter
- MOVE Services
 - Internet Access via WiFi (at MOVE vehicle, in shelter)
 - Power Bank distribution and recharge
 - Information distribution
 (printed hand-outs, video panels, satellite & local TV)
- MOVE dependency on ARC
 - Shelter, food, sanitary facilities for IEEE volunteers (4-6)
 - Diesel fuel (after 3rd day) and/or AC power (220V/50A)
 - Official information for hand-out & video displays



IEEE Volunteer Training, Certification, Credentials

- IEEE provides training except Red Cross courses:
 - First Aid CPR/AED (reduced fee?)40 hour independent prep, full day course
 - Expiration (2yr), Recertification requirements (short course)
 - Interacting with disaster survivors
- Red Cross provides IEEE volunteer credentials
 - Valid in all geographic locations, not just volunteer home (may require local Red Cross Chapter membership)
 - IEEE volunteers encouraged to join local
 Red Cross Chapter but MOVE duties take priority during disaster response with MOVE deployment



IEEE Volunteer Training, Certification, Credentials (2)

- FEMA Emergency Management Institute courses
 - IS 100.b Introduction to Incident Command System
 - IS 200.b ICS for Single Resources and Initial Action Incidents
 - IS 700 National Incident Management System (NIMS),
 An Introduction
 - IS 800.b National Response Framework, An Introduction (optional)

Each about a 4 hour endeavor

IEEE Member Opportunities

- MOVE System Design & Implementation (HW & SW)
 - Expandable WiFi Mesh Network design
 - Power Pack recharger (200 to 300 units)
 - Video editing and manipulation
- Documentation
 - MOVE vehicle and system maintenance manuals
 - Volunteer training courses on MOVE deployment & operation
 - Administrative procedures (e.g., vehicle licensing, volunteer mobilization web application, volunteer qualification database)

 - First Aid with AED & CPR (currently \$90, negotiating reduction)
