Region 3 FluidReview Portal

- Region 3 uses the FluidReview portal for awards nominations
- Allows updating / resubmission of previously submitted (nonwinning) nominations!

https://ieee-r3.fluidreview.com/

- Select <Sign Up> on the right side (not same as IEEE credentials)
- Fill in requested information; you will receive an email confirmation
- Start early!
 - Gather information on candidate
 - Get two endorsement letters
 - Allow time for "features" of website

Write nomination specifically to a specific award's criteria



Region 3 FluidReview Portal

https://ieee-r3.fluidreview.com/

- Complete the nomination form for each award you wish to submit a nominee.
 - ➤ The nomination form includes the purpose of each award and a general and specific basis of selection for the award.
 - For most of the awards, two IEEE members must endorse the nomination.
 - ➤ Complete the "Request endorsement" tasks within the portal, providing the Endorsers' names and email addresses.
 - ➤ Endorsers will receive an email with a link directing them to the portal. They can either complete the endorsement form already in the portal or upload their own endorsement letter.
 - > Nominators should also email the Endorsers to let them know to expect the email from FluidReview.
- Once complete, "Submit Nomination" within the Region 3
 FluidReview Portal.

Region 3 General Criteria

- Level and extent of distinction for specific award
- Productivity of contributions for specific award
- Service to Institute
- Service to profession outside of IEEE
- See Specific Criteria AND General Guidance sections for award of interest in ARC manual
- General descriptions of each award follow



Region 3 Award-Specific Criteria

Daniel W. Jackson Award

Purpose: To recognize a <u>Past Director</u> who, through continuing service to the Region and to the Institute, has made exemplary contributions to the electrotechnology profession.

Joseph M. Biedenbach Outstanding Engineering Educator Award

Purpose: To recognize a member of Region 3 who has shared technical and professional abilities through <u>teaching</u> in industry, government, or in an institution of higher learning and in so doing has made an outstanding contribution to the electrotechnology profession.

Region 3 Outstanding Engineer Award

To recognize a member of Region 3 who, through <u>technical</u> and professional abilities, has made an outstanding contribution to the electrotechnology profession.



Region 3 Award-Specific Criteria (continued)

- Region 3 Outstanding Service Award
 Purpose: To recognize a member of Region 3 who, through service to the Region and the Institute, has made an outstanding contribution to the electrotechnology profession.
- Professional Leadership Award
 Purpose: To recognize a member of Region 3 for outstanding leadership efforts in achieving the <u>professional</u> [economic, ethical, legislative, social] aims of IEEE in the United States.
- Employer Professional Development Award
 Purpose: To recognize an employer in Region 3 for outstanding contributions in advancing the <u>professional development</u> of employees.

Feedback from 2017

- Some accounts not showing all the links necessary, such as links to endorsements
 - -ARC chair inquiring about fixing this
 - -Contact the ARC chair when have issues
- Unable to look up all data on requested nominee
 - ARC Chair is inquiring about whether this can be autopopulated for you given nominee name and IEEE number
 - -Other options:
 - Ask a member of your Section ExCom or an R3 officer (not a committee chair) to look it up for you
 - Ask the nominee (it doesn't have to be secret)
