

IEEE Region 3 Student Branch Travel Reimbursement

• Mileage

• Each student branch will be reimbursed for the roundtrip mileage of one (1) vehicle at the mileage rate authorized by the IEEE Controller (~\$0.50 per mile)

• Per Diem (food/lodging/incidentals)

(a) Branch Chair at \$40/day, 2.5 days maximum - must attend Student Branch Leadership meeting (this meeting)

(b) Branch Counselor at \$40/day, 2.5 days maximum - must attend Student Branch Counselors meeting(this meeting)

1. Elect Student Leaders and Branch Counselor

Branch Counselor

- Required by IEEE
- Maintains relations with section and community
- Helps organize events
- Works at your University

How to get a Branch Counselor

- Ask!
- ... or Your Branch Elects Them
- ... or Your Section Chair Appoints Them
- Department Chair Has Veto Rights

2. Plan Events

- What, when, where?
 - Weekly/monthly meetings, same time, same place
- Workshops and Tutorials
 - New tech from Industry Mentors
 - Class labs or homework help
- Collaborate with
 - Your section
 - Neighboring Student Branches
 - Local start-ups and industry

3. Find Volunteers

- Be respectful of their time
- Make them feel their contributions are important
- Give them recognition
- Thank them!
- Give them an "official" title
- Get commitments
- Make sure they have input on the event/process if possible

Student Branch Reporting

Student Branch Annual Plan (Due February 1st)

To help you keep track of your yearly activities, your Student Branch is required to submit the Student Branch Annual Plan. It also serves as a valuable historical document to aid future executives in their planning and records financial statements so it is important that the Student Branch Treasurer is involved in the preparation of the report. The due date for filing your Annual Plan is on or before 1 February annually.

Visit Annual Plan

Student Branch Rebate/Allotments

You will want to engage your local Section with the development of your plan. To encourage you to submit this plan and to meet IEEE Bylaw requirements, an incentive allotment of US\$100 is given if your Branch has 50 or more members or US\$50 if your Student Branch has fewer than 50 members. In addition, IEEE provides an incentive rebate of US\$2 per Student or Graduate Student member at your Branch (based on membership statistics as of 31 December of the previous year).

Student Branch Meeting/Activity/Event Reporting (4 per year)

Completing the Student Branch Activity Report should help you evaluate the success of your program and to provide some continuity for future years. IEEE requires that Student Branches report their activities and maintain a minimum of 10 Student or Graduate Student members.

Visit Event Reporting

Student Branch Officer Reporting (Ongoing)

Each time a new ExCom member or Branch Counselor is selected to serve at your Student Branch, the IEEE Operations Center must be notified.







APPENDIX

Student Branch Chair

- Appoints committee chairs.
- Prepares necessary reports for IEEE Student Services.
- Arranges for election of new Officers before leaving office.
- Works with Branch Counselor in dealings with the Department and Faculty and local IEEE Section.

Student Branch Secretary

- Keeps minutes of all Branch meetings and activities.
- Carries out all necessary communications of the Branch, including the filing of reports with IEEE Headquarters.
- Maintains IEEE forms and supplies as required.

Student Branch Treasurer

- Deposits all monies received promptly in the Student Branch account.
- Prepares a budget at the start of the school (or fiscal) year.
- Prepares end-of-year Financial Statements.
- Co-signing Officer (jointly with the Student Branch Chair).

Student Branch Web Master

- Comply with the guidelines established in this document and related IEEE policy
- Follow ownership rights of intellectual property
- Protect confidential and copyrighted information and materials
- Do not link to sites that are not complementary to the IEEE mission

Student Branch Counselor

- Faculty member, active in the IEEE, who serves as an advisor to the Branch and its Officers.
- Student members and the Regional Student Activities Chair (RSAC).
- Promotes student awareness of awards, contests and membership benefits.
- Helps the Branch establish Industrial contacts and works closely with the Branch Officers and the Branch Mentor.
- Normal term of appointment (or re-appointment) is two years.

Student Branch Mentor

- Designed to maximize the interaction between the Student Branch and the local Section.
- Branch Mentor must be from Industry.
- A recent graduate with firsthand experience in Student Branch operations is an ideal candidate.
- Assists the Branch to develop effective programs.
- Position is optional but can help Branches stay connected.
