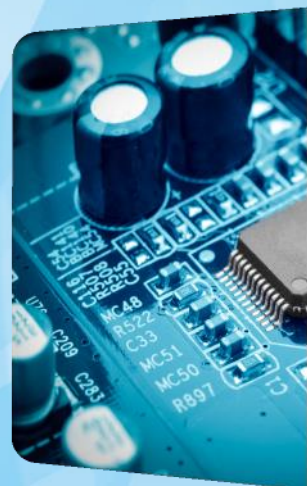
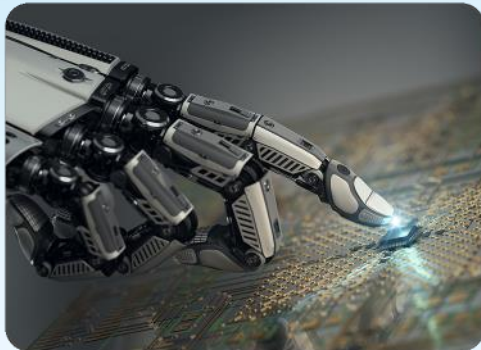

What are Areas

Region 3 Meeting

- Paraphrasing: An Area is a part of a Region, consisting of several Sections, which is established by the Region Committee for the purpose of improving communications within and management of the Region
 - Area Chairs are appointed by the Region Director
 - The Area Chair acts on behalf of and at the direction of the Region Director on specific assignments related to the management and administration of the Region
 - The Area Chair(s) may serve on the Region Committee with the approval of the Region Committee
- Areas are a line of insight into Section health, and a way to share resources, best practices, and training
- Director-Elect works directly with the Area Chairs

What are Geographic Councils

Region 3 Meeting

- Paraphrasing: A Council is formed by agreement of a group of contiguous Sections, and it exists at their pleasure – it is subordinate to the Sections and the Sections direct its operation
 - Sections can join existing Councils
 - Sections can withdraw from Councils

- Councils are a way for Sections to work together to do things they perhaps could not do, or could not do as effectively, on their own

Why Make Changes

Region 3 Meeting

- There are currently 9 Areas, ranging in size from 1 Section to 12 Sections
- There are currently 3 Councils
- Governing documents are not in agreement:
 - From the R3 bylaws: “Where the Sections in a state or other geographical area form a Council and elect a chair, this elected chair will serve also as the Area Chair for that group of Sections.”
 - From the R3 Operations Manual: “An Area Chair represents the Region in each Area. It is permissible to substitute a Council Chair in the event the Council boundaries encompass the geographic Area. There can be one or more Councils in an Area.”

Why Make Changes

Region 3 Meeting

- An Area Chair that also serves as a Council Chair is supposed to operate both at the direction of the Sections AND at the direction of the Region Director
- Changes to Areas will not affect Councils. Current Councils can remain as they are
- Reducing the number of Areas/Area Chairs allows more of the ExCom members to serve on the Region Committee, while still leaving the majority of the Region Committee as the Section Chairs (41 Sections chairs)

Process

Region 3 Meeting

- Region Directors starting in 2014 have suggested and studied a reduction in the number of Areas
- Meetings with Area Chairs were held at several SoutheastCons to discuss this, including the currently proposed change
- Two ad hocs have studied the problem and reported their findings in 2019 and 2020

Process

Region 3 Meeting

- Based on the findings of the 2020 Ad Hoc, I recommended that we proceed with their suggested reduction to 5 Areas
- Strategic Operations and Support Committee (SOSC) voted to approve the change and begin the process of modifying governing documents
- SOSC distributed the governing document changes in January, and discussed the changes at both the January and February ExCom meetings, with a motion in February

Process

Region 3 Meeting

- The ExCom approved the February motion
- A motion will be presented tomorrow to the Region 3 Committee to approve the changes
- If the motion passes, the changes will be sent forward through MGA for legal and governance reviews, then MGA Board approval (hopefully June)
- If approved, the new Areas will be effective on Jan 1, 2022
