MOVE Truck General Description

Capabilities

- High speed satellite uplinks to provide WiFi internet access
- High speed managed network switch for wired office networks
- Multi-vendor LTE (Cellular) access
- 10/20 kW generator
- 900 W solar panel array for recharging on-board batteries MOVE-1
- Wireless access, Ethernet, IP telephone, videoconferencing
- Internet commercial firewall and Internet security devices
- Recharging capability for 50 simultaneous solar battery packs
- Transporting equipment between locations
- HAM and Public Safety radios

IEEE MOVE truck teams

- Trucks are designed, maintained, and operated by IEEE volunteers
- All IEEE volunteers that deploy are also American Red Cross volunteers with DST GAPs
- Special qualified drivers, more being trained
- Over 300 trained volunteers
 - Most have technology backgrounds
 - Spread throughout the country
 - Ongoing training for new members




Support Teams


