### Submission Instruction

All submissions should include title, author(s), affiliation and address of correspondence author (postal and email), and up to five key words. Interested authors are encouraged to submit their paper in electronic attachment format using MS Word 97, PDF or PostScript to the following e-mail [sabatto@harpo.tnstate.edu](mailto:sabatto@harpo.tnstate.edu).

#### 1. Full-Length (refereed) Papers

Submit four (4) copies of the entire paper to the Technical Program Chair by the due date. The paper length is limited to eight (8) pages, 8.5" x 11", in one column format and 10 points or larger font size.

#### 2. Short (abstract) Paper

Submit four (4) copies of an extended abstract (500 words) to the Technical Program Chair. The abstract must include objective of the work, technical approach used, progress of the work performed and the most important results acquired.
