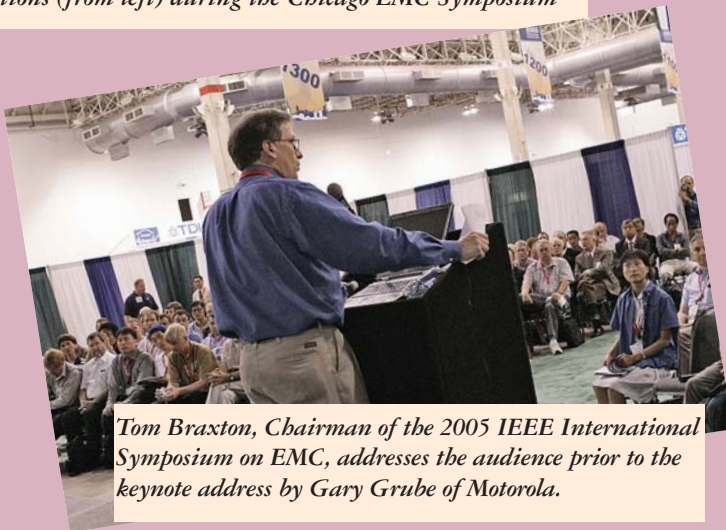

Cybershield brought a lot of product to Chicago to display. Jim Skelly was on hand to help visitors to their booth with applications.



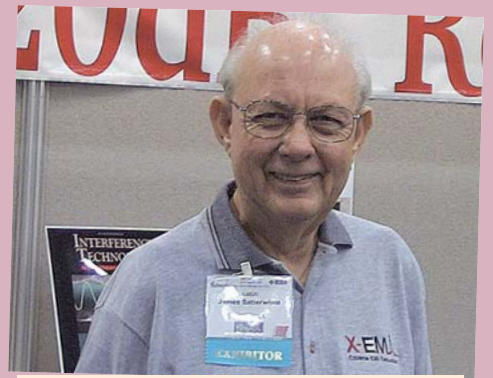
AR Worldwide held their popular raffle for a prize during the Chicago Symposium. This year it was a set of top-notch golf clubs!

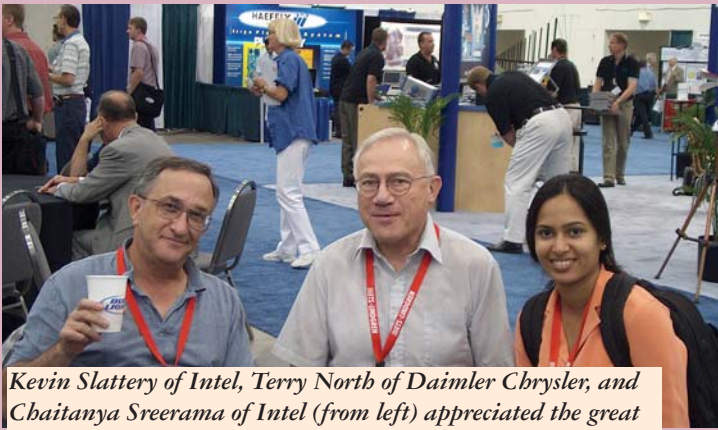
