

CITY TOUR MONTRÉAL CLASSICAL AND DINNER



Discover the history, evolution and unique atmosphere of Montréal with your guide. This overview tour covers **Old Montréal**, the birthplace of our city. You will see an area rich in architectural details dating back to the 17th Century. A visit of the world famous **Notre-Dame Basilica** can be included (entrance fees applicable).

The magnificent avant-garde architecture of **downtown Montréal**, the Financial and Commercial district, as well as the brand new **International Quarter** will also be viewed. You will also be introduced to the "**Underground City**", the world's largest underground network.

On our way, you will be impressed by the **Golden Square Mile** where 70% of the Canadian wealth was concentrated in the turn of the 20th Century. A drive to the summit of **Mount Royal** will give you a spectacular view of the city skyline (photo stop). Continuing through **Mount Royal Park**, you will arrive in front of impressive **Saint-Joseph's Oratory**, a Roman Gothic shrine.

On the **Plateau Mont-Royal**, in the **Latin Quarter** and along **St. Laurent Boulevard**, you will discover the distinctive lifestyles of the different ethnic groups which make up our city. You will also glimpse **Outremont** and **Westmount**, the city's most exclusive and expensive residential areas.

You will also visit **Jean-Drapeau Park** (Saint Hélène and Notre-Dame Islands), site of 1967 World Fair, Expo 67. There you will see the beautiful floral park, the **Gilles-Villeneuve Racetrack** for the Formula 1 Canada Grand Prix, the **Montréal Casino** and **La Ronde Amusement Park** (member of the Six Flags family).

A drive by **Montréal's Harbour** takes you on the eastside to the **Olympic Park**, site of the 1976 Summer Olympic Games. There will be time for a photo stop of the **Olympic Stadium** and the **Montréal Tower**, the world's highest inclined tower in the world. You will also drive by the **Maisonneuve Park** and the **Montréal Botanical Gardens**.

Fourquet Fourchette is a unique concept.

The "**fourquet**" (known as mashing rake in English) is an instrument traditionally used by brewers to process water and malted grains in the mash tun in order to convert the starch into fermentable sugars to produce a fluid mass called wort.

The "**fourchette**" is a fork.

Combine the two and you have our logo, symbolizing the ideal marriage between gastronomy and a love of beer.

That is the essence of our concept.

The Fourquet Fourchette is an invitation to immerse yourself in the lost era of New France and its native culture. Allow our traditional décor and staff to take you back in time. Treat yourself to a wonderful meal complemented by local Unibroue beers and a fine selection of regional wines.

Whether you choose to indulge yourself on the shore of the Richelieu River at Fort Chambly or in Old Montreal's International District, the spirit of New France is alive and well at Fourquet Fourchette.

Le **Fourquet Fourchette** porte un nom et une signature qui reflètent clairement son concept unique.

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Le « **fourquet** » évoque la bière et ses artisans; il est l'instrument traditionnel du brasseur qui s'en servait pour mélanger l'eau et le grain malté dans la cuve d'empattage pour transformer l'amidon de la céréale en sucre fermentescible, formant une masse liquide appelée le moût.

La « **fourchette** » évoque naturellement la gastronomie.

La combinaison du « fourquet » et de la « fourchette »...

...crée une enseigne qui véhicule l'essence du concept et supporte les armoiries du restaurant.
