Introduction for Creating an Effective 15 Minute Presentation

- Background
 - A detailed study of a 6 10 page research paper: requires 2 – 3 hours
- The Presentation
 - A 15 minute presentation of this paper: requires careful preparation
 - This leaves 5 minutes for questions

Consider Your Audience

- ~ 10% really interested: will listen closely
- ~ 25% familiar with the subject: may be attentive
- ~ 35% have a general interest: need to keep their attention
- ~ 30% little interest: entice them to listen

Purpose of the Presentation

- 1) To <u>briefly</u> cover the paper's major points in 15 minutes leaving 5 minutes for questions:
 - a) Purpose
 - b) Experiment or Analysis
 - c) Results
 - d) Discussion & Conclusions
- 2) Encourage audience to actually read the paper
- 3) NOT to present every last detail in the paper! That is NOT possible in 15 minutes!
- 4) This leaves 5 minutes for questions which is one of he major advantages of a Conference presentation

Power-Point Slides for a 15 Minute Conference Presentation

- Title
- 10 12 Power Point Slides <u>Maximum</u>
 - Allows 1.5 1.25 minutes per slide
 - Limit each slide to only the essential information
 - Maximum 12 lines of written material on each slide in addition to the slide's title
 - Large font on Figure labels
 - DO NOT overload slide with information
 - KISS: Keep It Simple, Scientist!
