On behalf of the NSW Section Committee I wish to congratulate John Robinson on receiving the Region 10 Outstanding Volunteer award for 2010.



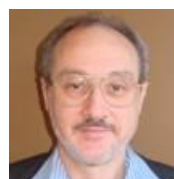
John has served on the Section Committee for more than 30 years in many capacities, a summary only of his services is listed below:

2.2 ANZSCON

IEEE Australia and New Zealand Student Congress (ANZSCON) was held in Melbourne last November. Congress was hosted by IEEE Victorian section with the support of IEEE Australia Council. The main objectives of the Congress were to bring students and GOLD members from all Australian and New Zealand Sections together, expand their networks, share ideas and discuss employment and/or further study opportunities. Congress was well attended with representation by Australian and New Zealand universities, academics, industry sponsors and other IEEE members during the three days. Congress was sponsored by over 10 industry sponsors.

The Three day congress started with a welcome reception on 24 November at the Ibis Hotel in Melbourne. The second day started with the opening address by the IEEE ANZSCON Chair Julia Gibney, followed by a key note speech from Joseph V Lillie key entitled "IEEE for You and the world". Other interesting speeches from distinguished lecturers, IEEE members and industry sponsors filled the remainder of the second day, concluding with a formal dinner.

On the last day IEEE gold representative Matthias Reumann gave an exciting talk on "The GOLDen years: A time full of transitions". The afternoon session started with an employer forum which allowed students to network and exchange ideas with several industry employers. The Project Poster Competition

was also held with around fifteen to twenty projects presented. The Competition was well attended by students, academics and industry sponsors. The judging panel for the poster competition was made up of three judges selected from industry, Academia and IEEE and prize money was awarded to the top three entries selected on the day. In addition there were several interesting talks running in a parallel session on Innovation and Entrepreneurship Based on an Experience from 1492 by Terry Polkinghorn, GINI (Global Integrated Network of IEEE Students) Workshop by Chuan-Zheng Lee and Humanitarian Technology Hour by Amarnath Raja. Three day congress concluded successfully with closing comments on 26th November evening.

2.4 IEEE Society on Social Implications of Technology (SSIT) returns to Sydney

IEEE SSIT Australia was chartered in December 2005, and is a national chapter exploring social implications of technologies. SSIT has convened meetings on a variety of topics including engineering ethics, water policy, energy policy, climate change, privacy, broadband regulation and cyborg implants. SSIT relaunched in Sydney in September 2010 with a technical meeting on the topic *ISP-level Internet Filtering: The Path to Deep Packet Inspection?* The new Sydney co-ordinator for SSIT Australia, Dr Lyria Bennett Moses, is planning further Sydney technical meetings in 2011. 2.6 IEEE.tv

In December 2010, IEEE.tv came to Australia to document Australia's involvement in solar technology for the documentary, "Catch the Sun." This documentary focuses attention on technological innovation and creative public policy that has led to the creation of the solar industry worldwide. In addition to Australia, locations for this documentary include China, Japan, India, the United Kingdom, Germany, Denmark, Spain, as well as the United States.

IEEE staff member, Helen H. Fung, worked with the producer Peter Wiesner, to set up interviews with Australian technical leaders in solar energy research, including Dr. Martin Green, who has received numerous awards for his work on photovoltaics, including the prestigious 1990 Cherry Award.

Peter and his Sydney-based crew, Brandon Batton and Leo Sullivan, documented work at the UNSW labs and visited one of the largest commercial solar installations at the Sydney Theatre Company. Afterwards, the crew drove to Newcastle to record scientists at CSIRO. Highlights included a demonstration of the solar tower and of the integration of intermittent wind and solar energy sources at the CSIRO Renewable energy Integration Facility.

After recording in the Sydney area, the producer and crew travelled to Adelaide to record interviews with researchers at Adelaide University, Unisa, and University of South Australia, as well as with entrepreneurs from Zen who have developed a solar farm for the Monarto Zoo near Adelaide. IEEE.tv covered the ceremonial dedication at the zoo by Quentin Bryce, Governor of South Australia.

The IEEE.tv documentary on solar energy, intended for wide public distribution, will be the second in a series of programs on renewable energy. 2.7 Visit by IEEE Top Volunteer Executives

On 1st December 2010 the IEEE NSW Section was privileged to receive both the candidates from the just completed IEEE Presidential election. One was the IEEE 2011 President elect Gordon Day. Gordon will be President in 2012. The second was highly respected IEEE volunteer Joe Lillie.

Gordon Day spent most of his career in research and management at the National Institute of Standards and Technology, where he founded and led the NIST Optoelectronics Division. More recently, he has served as science advisor to a U.S. Senator and as Director of Government Relations for the Optoelectronics Industry Development Association. He is a past President of the IEEE Photonics Society and of IEEE-USA, and a Fellow of IEEE, the Optical Society of America, the American Association for the Advancement of Science and the Institute of Physics in the UK.

Joe Lillie has 37 years experience in telecommunications engineering and management with most of his career at Bellsouth/AT&T. After retirement, he returned to AT&T in 2005, working on Hurricane Katrina restoration. He has served six years on the IEEE Board of Directors, two years each as Region Director, Treasurer, and Vice President for Member and Geographic Activities. He has also served seven years on the IEEE Finance committee.

The Section Executive Committee with chair for the night, 2011 Section Vice-Chair Ian Boyd, both entertained and held discussions with the visitors at the Baia Restaurant in Darling Harbour. A number of special subjects were raised with the President elect which should be of relevance to Australian IEEE members. One was of course relations with the local professional bodies Engineers Australia and ACS. Gordon Day had in fact just come from discussions

with Engineers Australia in Canberra. Canvassed in detail was the current and future state of the IEEE, including the very pleasing growth in IEEE membership over recent times.

2.8 IEEE NSW Vice-Chair Honoured as ACS Fellow

On 26th October 2010 IEEE NSW 2011 Vice-Chair Ian Boyd was elected Fellow by the National Board of the ACS. Ian thus joined the list of IEEE members who have been honoured as Fellows by the ACS. The ACS (Australian Computer Society) is an Australian professional association for those working in Information and Communications Technology. An ACS Fellow is a person who has made a

distinguished contribution to the field of Information and Communications Technology in Australia. ACS NSW Chair Patrick Wilson said in presenting the award "it is easier to pass through the eye of a needle than to become a Fellow of the ACS".

Ian (picture right) was presented with a lengthy citation attesting to his distinguished contribution to the field of Information and Communications Technology. Part of this Citation reads "Ian Boyd has been a devoted advocate of ICT in industry through his leadership role in the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE)". The award was also announced in the January-February 2011 issue of "Information Age".



Ian is currently Vice-Chair of the NSW Section. He has served as Treasurer of the NSW section for three years, as Secretary of the IEEE Australia Council for two years and as Vice-Chair of the IEEE Australia Council for two years.

2.9 Vale John Bennett

Former IEEE Life Member, Emeritus Professor of Computer Science, John Bennett sadly passed away at his home in Sydney on 9 December 2010.

John was one of the pioneers of the information technology industry in Australia. John received degrees in Electrical and Mechanical engineering from the University of Queensland, and a PhD in Computer Science from Cambridge University - where he had been involved in the design and construction of the early EDSAC computer. In 1956 he returned to Australia to manage the software and guide future users of Sydney Universities' newly Australian built SILLIAC computer.

John became the Foundation Professor of Computer Science at the University of Sydney, and in 1972 he became head of the new Basser Department of Computer Science.

He was also the Foundation Chairman of the Australian Committee on Computation and Automatic Control from 1959 to 1963, the President of the New South Wales Computer Society from 1965 to 1966, and the Foundation President of the Australian Computer Society from 1966 to 1967. In 1981 he helped found the Research Foundation for Information

Technology at the University. In 1983 he became an Officer of the Order of Australia (AO). In 1986 Bennett, aged 65, retired.

In spite of his record, John never became an IEEE Fellow. When approached by the IEEE NSW Section in 2002 for nomination as an IEEE Fellow, John replied: "I am now in my 81-st year. I suggest someone younger would be more appropriate."

John lived with his wife, Rosalind Mary (née Elkington), in Sydney's Northern Beaches. He had four children and six grandchildren.

2.11 MQ Engineering Colloquia Update

In an icebreaking series of talks organised at Macquarie University under the Macquarie University Engineering Colloquia (MQEC), various interesting topics were covered.

We started our series of talks with a presentation entitled "Electrostatic Discharge (ESD) Challenges in Modern and Future Integrated Circuits" by Dr. Juin J. Liou. Dr. Liou served as the IEEE EDS Vice-President for Regions/Chapters, IEEE EDS Treasurer, IEEE EDS. We also had a talk from Irina Rabeja entitled "Image Compression Techniques". Irina serves as a consultant to the Institute of Research in Chemistry, Romania. Professor Andrew Dzurak presented some of his latest research work in a talk entitled "Single-Atom Nanoelectronics and Spin Qubits in Silicon".

We recently had Associate Professor Ladislau Matekovits present on "Periodic Structures in the Field of Antennas: a Challenging Subject". Another recent talk was entitled "Technologies for Radio-Based Imaging Systems of the Very Large and Very Small Kind" by Dr. Andrew Helicar. A/Prof Matekovits is a Marie Curie Fellow at the Macquarie University. He is also serving as faculty at Electronics Department of the Politecnico di Torino, Italy. Dr. Matekovits is the recipient of a Raj Mittra Travel Grant (RMTG) - Student Researcher Award for participating in the 1997 IEEE AP-S International Symposium in Montreal, Canada; of a 1998 URSI Young Scientist Award (Thessaloniki, Greece); of the Barzilai Award 1998 (young scientist award, granted every two years by the Italian National Electromagnetic Group); of a 10th MICROCOLL Young Scientist Award 1999 (Budapest, Hungary), and of the Best AP2000 Oral Paper on Antennas, ESA-EUREL Millennium Conference on Antennas & Propagation (Davos, Switzerland).
