Joint IEEE/IEAust Seminar

The first was the joint IEEE/IEAust Electrical Branch presentation held on the 28th of August in the Hawken Auditorium at Engineering House. Dr Andrew Dicks, a former member of the UK Government Fuel Cell Advisory panel now continuing his research at the University of Queensland, delivered a presentation on "The Current Status of Fuel Cells Worldwide". This excellent presentation was enjoyed by approximately 20 attendees and special thanks must go to Andrew Simpson from the University of Queensland who stepped in to chair this seminar at short notice. Thanks should also go to the IEAust representatives for their valuable assistance in organising this event.

Deregulation of Electricity: Promises and Challenges

The Power Chapter was also fortunate to have a recent visit from Professor Nurul Chowdhury of the University of Saskatchewan in Canada. Professor Chowdhury delivered a seminar at the University of Queensland on the 20th of September entitled "Deregulation of Electricity: Promises and Challenges". Although this seminar was held at fairly short notice, it was still well attended with over 30 people listening to Professor Chowdhury's account of the effectiveness of electricity restructuring in North America. Many of the issues raised were also relevant to the Australian electricity market, ensuring a lively discussion continued after the seminar.

Given the interest generated by Professor Chowdhury's presentation we will attempt to secure a speaker from the Australian National Electricity Market Management Company (NEMMCO) to outline the current status of the Australian electricity market.

"Quantum computing: why the fuss?" Dr. Howard Wiseman

Quantum computers have been predicted to take over from conventional ("classical") computers within 20 years. Using the simplest possible example (a single quantum bit), I will show how quantum computers are more powerful. I will then review the motivation for, and progress in the effort to build a real quantum computer.

About the speaker:

Dr. Howard Wiseman is a QEII research fellow and senior lecturer in the School of Science at Griffith University. His background is in quantum optics, the quantum theory of light and its interactions. More recently he has been exploring areas in quantum information, including small quantum computers (theory and experiment), and quantum entanglement of identical particles.
