Appendix 3: Student Activities Status

Status Student Activities 4-16-12

We've just completed the 16th Robot Challenge. The written Reports were probably the best we've read, but many of the robots were not as robust, and needed serious help from the wizards at the PIT.

58 Written Reports were submitted, 45 teams participated in all events for 2-leg robots and 6 teams participated in all events for 4-leg teams, for a total of 51 teams. This compared with 32 2-leg teams and 13 4-leg teams, for a total of 46 teams last year.

In the 2-leg Manual category, in

1st Place was Team 18, Team Maryland form Wilde Lake High School, with a total of 87.5 points. 2nd Place was Team 22, Roborilla, also from Wilde Lake High School, with a total of 80 points. 3rd Place was Team 48, U. of California Santa Cruz, from Charles H. Flowers, with a total of 74.5 points.

In the 4-leg Manual category, in

- 1st Place was Team 105, Phineas and Ferb, Maryvale Prep, with a total of 62.5 points.
- 2nd Place was Team 106, Team Bred, from Charles H. Flowers, with a total of 61.5 points.
- 3rd Place was Team 104, Robomagic, Maryvale Prep, with a total of 51 points.

In the 2-leg Overall category, in

- 1st Place was Team 11, Team Sickos, Beth Tfiloh, with a total of 102 points.
- 2nd Place was Team 18, Team Maryland from Wilde Lake High School, with a total of 87.5 points.
- 3rd Place was Team 62, Super Special Awesome, Arundel High School, with a total of 87.5 points.

In the 4-leg Overall category, in

- 1st Place was Team 103, March of the Penguins, Beth Tfiloh, with a total of 88.5 points.
- 2nd Place was Team 102, Pirates, Beth Tfiloh, with a total of 80 points.
- 3rd Place was Team 105, Phineas and Fern, Maryvale Prep, with a total of 62.5 points.

Scoring was good but a little rushed as the Museum had functions immediately following our event, both days, and caterers were coming in to prepare the floors and tables. One error in the scoring was attributed to this rush, but it was worked out after the sheets were reviewed.
