4. OLD BUSINESS

- Robot Challenge (Neville)
 - 8 teachers participated in training program. Now at 71 two leg robots and 13 four-leg robots. There are 15 teams attempting automation which is up from 9 teams last year.
 - The Baltimore Museum of Industry is requesting to be paid \$9k to cover the cost of their hosting our activities.
 - o After a quick study, it was determined that the \$9k is reasonable
 - Team is proposing to make a payment of \$2k to cover the cost of the robot challenge and cut back our donation to the Engineering Society of Baltimore from \$750 to \$250 and use the \$500 towards the \$2k to the Baltimore Museum of Industry.
 - We would like to pay BMI directly via an invoice from them
 - A motion was made to make the two payments
 - Discussion centered around pursuing other areas of funding, and particular language we are using. We would need to have an invoice for a set of services as opposed to a donation
 - O Also, we need to determine if the Baltimore Museum of Industry is set at \$9k to host any challenge or whether they will accept our \$2k
 - ACTION: The UMBC IEEE student chapter will investigate whether their school can host
 - ACTION: Neville to provide logistic needs to UMBC students (1 large room and 8 small rooms)
 - Neville, wants to keep things steady this year and we will revisit potential venues for next year
 - o Motion is for this year only, we offer BMI for \$2000 to pay an invoice for hosting our robotic challenge and a we reduce our donation to ESB to \$250; Motion PASSED
 - Motion to approve spending an additional \$14/month insurance charge to cover material in the storage locker; Motion PASSSED
 - Neville has not been able to reach Walt's wife; Neville and Anna to send a letter to the home address
