Middle Tennessee Section Merger

The Middle Tennessee Section of Region 3 of the IEEE serves the Tullahoma, TN, area. Middle Tennessee Section membership has dropped below that necessary to remain a separate section (50 total). Dick Riddle, who is the Chairman of Region 3, and IEEE-USA have recommended that we merge the Middle Tennessee section into the Nashville Section. I concur with their recommendation. This gives us an opportunity to reorganize the section to deal with the geographic separation of our constituents. The revised Nashville Section supports three separate geographies: Nashville Metropolitan Service Area, Cookeville, and Tullahoma. During the upcoming months, I would appreciate any feedback regarding how we might better integrate our colleagues located in the outlying areas into Nashville Metro activities. One example that has been suggested is to have one monthly meeting per semester at each of the remote locations (4 remote meetings/year), with the members in that locale providing the speaker and venue. We also need to consider changing the name of the section to better represent the diverse geographies that we support. One name suggestion is "Nashville Metro". I will use this name as a temporary designation for the merged section.

The proposed merger plan is to create a new section with an executive committee (ExCom) structured similar to the Region 3 ExCom. The Nashville Metro ExCom will include section officers of Chair, Vice Chair, and Secretary/Treasurer. These officers would be elected at large by the total section membership. In addition, the section ExCom will include Area Chairs of the three geographies supported by Nashville Metro: Tullahoma, Cookeville, and Nashville. Each Area Chair would be elected by the local area membership. Until the next election, Area Chairs would be appointed by the existing Nashville ExCom. Area Chairs would have a seat on the Nashville Metro ExCom, and would participate in the management of the section, as well as the activities within their respective area. If an area desired, they could schedule their own meetings, develop their own newsletter, and publish their own web site. The section will continue to maintain a web site for the total section, with links to the respective area web sites.

There are many other logistical issues that must be ironed out and incorporated into the Nashville Metro Bylaws. As previously noted, our the Bylaws are badly in need of an update. The revised bylaws will be posted on the web site, and approved by the membership. Please send any comments on the bylaws that you may have to our editor, Bob Allen, at rva@microlid.com.
