Dr. Lott is currently Director of the Center for Teaching Excellence and Professor Emeritus in the Department of Mathematical Sciences at the University of Montana, where he served 31 years and was Department Chair from 1990 through 1992. His book for elementary mathematics teachers (with UM's Rick Billstein and the University of Oregon's Shlomo Libeskind) has served as the standard for three decades and will be released in its Ninth edition in 2006.
