Engineers Without Borders at Montana State University (EWB-MSU) is a student-led organization committed to providing sustainable water sources and sanitation solutions for fifty-eight primary schools and their communities in the Khwisero region of western Kenya. To date, EWB-MSU has reached five of these schools, installing five boreholes and two composting latrines. Intent on affecting concrete change, EWB-MSU has also conducted regional water quality tests, mapped the Khwisero area, and has and continues to assess, via surveys and other methods, the effectiveness of its projects. During its presentation to IEEE, members of EWB-MSU will detail the organization's past work, outline our current and future plans, and emphasize how people from all disciplines may become involved.
