A few new things are now on the list. Note the availability of IEEE e-books. You can now download classic texts on various electrical engineering topics. The IEEE has now added its own "social network": IEEE memberNet. This is similar to LinkedIn, but is open only to IEEE members. You must "opt in", so only the information that you want to share with other IEEE members is made available on memberNet. A third benefit, targeting students, is FREE Microsoft Software. This includes word processing tools, compilers, design tools, and more.
