We are very fortunate to have Kevin Duesman of MICRON Technologies as our speaker. Kevin was raised on a farm in Texas. He worked 8 years at Mostek in Dallas in fab processing and later product engineering on 4K through 64k drams. In 1982 started at MICRON as a product engineer, then product engineering manager and design manager. He currently manages several engineering groups and is a Principal Fellow in MICRON's Technical Career Ladder. He will talk about MICRON's CMOS Imagers that are designed to replace CCD devices (e.g., in digital cameras) at a fraction of the cost of CCDs. He will discuss:

- * What is a active pixel?
- * How imagers are designed
- * What other circuitry is need to support the pixel array (ADC, DAC)
- * How imagers are specified and characterized

E-mail Addresses – One More Time

Give some thought to obtaining an IEEE alias e-mail address if you don't have one. First you have to obtain an IEEE Web Account. This is standard since there are increasing number of services that are being offered/provided to IEEE members through the IEEE Web site. In order to be able to restrict these services "only" to IEEE members you will need the Web Account. The Montana Moose Call Montana Section of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers

To open a web account go to the IEEE Home Page. On the top selection bar is "IEEE Web Account". Click on it and it will walk you through setting it up.

Once you have the account established you can set up an IEEE alias: On the IEEE Home page, click on "Services" listed on the side bar. Click on "IEEE Personal Email Alias and Virus Scan Service". The site will then walk you through the steps on creating, updating or deleting an IEEE Email Alias. IEEE aliases are rewarded with a *really good* virus checker/eliminator.
