Merry Christmas! Well, almost ... It's already December and soon we'll be bringing a close to 2006. This has been a busy and rewarding year for me, and it has certainly been my pleasure to serve as Section Chair. Richard Wolff will be taking over Chair duties in January and I know he will serve you well in 2007.

One of my favorite activities from this year has just wrapped up, but it's an activity that will live on beyond 2006. Our section was awarded a PACE grant from IEEE to investigate and plan for K-12 outreach activities to promote science and engineering. Thanks to the help of our Life Members, we surveyed 13 science and math teachers at 4 middle schools in the Bozeman area, to determine the best programs and venues for IEEE members to work with teachers and students. While the suggestions and needs varied, there was a unanimous positive response, and we will certainly be doing work in the schools in 2007.

To start this effort, we used PACE grant funds to buy two Lego Mindstorms NXT kits, one each for the two student branches in our section, for use in K-12 outreach efforts. The picture below shows Damon Piocos, a student from MSU Northern, with one of these kits. To my surprise, Damon told me that he had already begun writing lesson plans for K-12 outreach using Lego Mindstorms prior to learning of this award. I'm confident that Damon and the other IEEE students at Northern will make excellent use of their kit, as will the IEEE student branch at MSU Bozeman, who also received on Lego kit. I'm appreciative to both of these groups for their enthusiasm on this project.


MANUFACTURING WARS: HOW AND WHY AMERICA LOST A DOMINANT POSITION IN GLOBAL MANUFACTURING
