# History 1 of 2

- 1955 IRE Toronto Section members start a conference to showcase Canadian industry
- 1971 Conference incorporated as IEEC Inc.
  reserve funds set aside to ensure financial stability
- 1972 Committee (CURF) funds IEEE student activities in Canada
- 1987 Conference ceases, CURF continues
- 1989 IEEC Inc. explores evolution into ICF

# History 2 of 2

- 1992 ICF is born by-law changes to meet requirements of the Public Trustee of Ontario
- 1993 Revenue Canada grants "registered charity status as a public foundation"
- 2004 Montreal Conferences Inc. joins ICF with funds and bilingual volunteers
- 2008 ICF membership includes all Sections
- 2012- ICF initiates Facebook presence

The newest IEEE McNaughton Learning Resource Centre established at UBC Okanagan - the School of Engineering matched the ICF grant and provided space for the centre, which is open to all UBC students. A contractor will train the villagers in the operation and maintenance of the solar power system, and help them to expand the system.

She left 3 solar cell phone chargers there to eliminate the need for a 1.5 hour drive to recharge the phones and laptops in the village.
