### 3. New Business

#### i. Oceans 2014 Conference

Dwight House and Randy Gillespie joined us today to seek our support to bring the Oceans 2014 conference to St. John's. This conference is jointly sponsored by IEEE and Marine Technology Society (MTS) and typically attracts 1500 to 2000 people. Representatives of IEEE (Bob Warnley and Jim Barbara) were here in October 2008 and returned a very positive report on the city recommending that the conference be brought here. MTS did not participate in the visit and are reluctant to support St. John's. Dwight recently spoke to Rich Lawson, the Executive Director for MTS. Mr. Lawson felt there were a number of reasons. As the conference has been just recently held in Vancouver in 2007 and Quebec City in 2008 he was concerned that it come back to Canada so soon. Dwight suggested to him that 2014 was a sufficient gap – some 6 years held outside of Canada. Secondly, he was concerned that some of MTS supporters, such as NOAH, would be reluctant to go to an international venue even though MTS purports to be an international society. Lastly, he was concerned over the low numbers of MTS in NL. It's estimated to be some 5-10 members here in the St. John's region. There is a student section of some 20 members but no official local Section.

Dwight felt that the lack of a local section here was the most significant issue. As the society is great organization in its own right and we have significant ocean technology community, we should pursue starting a local chapter. Dwight has received a copy of MTS's operational guidelines that directs how to set up a local section. The minimum membership is 15 with a \$75 fee. Dwight proposed that IEEE, Oceans Advance and MTS form a working relationship and develop some joint activities. There are definitely joint, even over lapping, interests in the oceans field within the academic and local industry. It would stimulate more cooperation /collaboration within the community and pooling resources for various section responsibilities. MTS draws more attention from industry whereas IEEE tends to be academic centric. The merging of the two seems to a natural for a small region like NL. With the amount of companies, research institutes, academic interest and government bodies with a focus on the ocean, not only should we be able to start a local section, but become a very active and leading relative to others. The attraction of hosting the Ocean 2014 conference here may be just the driving force to bring the various groups together - which in itself is very positive. Dwight's goal is to announce at this year's Ocean conference that St. John's will be the host in 2014.

Eric gave the Section's support is setting up a local MTS Section and pursuing the Oceans 2014 conference. It would be ideal if we could set up a joint Section with same executive. Lori will check the IEEE website so see if there is a precedent for a joint section. We need to have this finalized by June.
