Activities

Currently the chapter is going through a transition phase which saw the re-launch of the website and a number of initiatives which are underway to support the development of the chapter and its aims to contribute towards the progression of computational intelligence research activities and cohesion in the UK and RI and to the success of the society as a whole. The chapter is relatively large, consisting of 205 members (March 1st 2010) including one life member (LM), six fellows (F), 34 senior members (SM), 128 members (M) and 35 graduate student members (GSM). The chapter's primary activity is a series of seminars which it hosts in collaboration with the Intelligent System Research Centre and the School of Computing and Intelligent Systems, University of Ulster. It is the intention that chapter will try to host other meetings in collaboration with seminars being organized within the departments of other committee members. New members have be assigned to the committee to assist in this endeavour. This year, a major focus has and will be on recruiting chapter officers to undertake the following roles: Area representatives, Industrial Liaison, Women Representative, and GOLD representative. The role of geographical area representatives is to organize regular chapter events in their region (at least twice yearly but hopefully many more) and report on the activities and outcomes of these events. For the e-newsletter, each regional representative will keep abreast of other CI-related events, activities, developments and news in their region. The information can then be populated in the chapter newsletter which is distributed to the entire UK chapter bi-annually. The following regional representatives have recently joined the committee - Ammar Belatreche (Northern Ireland Representative) and Simon Coupland (England Representative). We are currently aiming to recruit enthusiastic and committed Wales and Rep. of Ireland representatives. A call will be sent to recruit new volunteers for the available positions.
