Committee Member Responsibilities

Challenges to Overcome

 - Biggest challenge is people sending in the information/photos to post.
 - Updating sites are difficult for the Sections with low # of volunteers
 - MCC is working alongside the Sections Support Committee (SCC) to help
- Reaching out to Sections to ensure Members needs are met
 - Helping Sections get information needed to support our Member Communications in all forms (i.e. website, social media platforms, etc.)
 - Supporting all forms of IEEE Membership (i.e. Students Members, YP, WIE, Senior Members and Life Members, and Fellows)
- Engaging members to share their IEEE experience with others
 - MCC has all the resources to support Sections on the benefits of IEEE and with Communications guidance.
