- Productivity of contributions for specific award
- Service to Institute
- Service to profession outside of IEEE
- See Specific Criteria AND General Guidance sections for award of interest in ARC manual

Region 3 Award-Specific Criteria

Daniel W. Jackson Award

Purpose: To recognize a <u>Past Director</u> who, through continuing service to the Region and to the Institute, has made exemplary contributions to the electrotechnology profession.

Joseph M. Biedenbach Outstanding Engineering Educator Award

Purpose: To recognize a member of Region 3 who has shared technical and professional abilities through <u>teaching</u> in industry, government, or in an institution of higher learning and in so doing has made an outstanding contribution to the electrotechnology profession.

Region 3 Outstanding Engineer Award

To recognize a member of Region 3 who, through <u>technical</u> and professional abilities, has made an outstanding contribution to the electrotechnology profession.



Region 3 Award-Specific Criteria (continued)

- Region 3 Outstanding Service Award Purpose: To recognize a member of Region 3 who, through service to the <u>Region</u> and the Institute, has made an outstanding contribution to the electrotechnology profession.
- Professional Leadership Award
 Purpose: To recognize a member of Region 3 for outstanding leadership efforts in achieving the professional [economic, ethical, legislative, social] aims of IEEE in the United States.
- Employer Professional Development Award Purpose: To recognize an employer in Region 3 for outstanding contributions in advancing the professional development of employees.
